Halloween Safety

Everyone loves a good scare on Halloween, but not when it comes to child safety. There are several easy and effective behaviours that parents can share with kids to help reduce their risk of injury.

Top Tips

- 1. Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colours. Since masks can sometimes obstruct a child's vision, try non-toxic face paint and make up whenever possible.
- 2. Get children you use glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers
- 3. Children under the age of 12 should not be alone at night without adult supervision.
- 4. When selecting a costume make sure it is the correct size to prevent trips and falls, and flame resistant
- 5. Never enter anybody's home, accept sweets from outside
- 6. Respect people's homes and only knock if houses are lit. Don't knock repeatedly
- 7. Remember your manners
- 8. Above all be safe and have fun!
