Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to school! We have had a busy and exciting week back with lots of great activities going on.

As we start a second National Lockdown, I would like to thank you for following the changes that have been made outside of school when you drop off and pick up your child. You will have noticed that staff are now wearing face coverings when they meet you at the gates. We continue to ensure that the children are washing their hands regularly and an enhanced cleaning programme continues in school. These measures help to keep the staff and children safe in school. <u>Please ensure you continue to contact school if you or someone you have come into contact with tests positive for COVID-19 so that we can take action as required.</u>

Next week, you will receive further information about remote learning. Remote learning means that children access their lessons if they are not able to attend school via SeeSaw. If your child has to isolate or if your child's class bubble has to close, work will be set the next day for them to access. There will be a home/school agreement for home learning to read and sign and the school's policy on blended learning for your information. National Online Safety

National Online Safety offers the school community training courses and resources for teachers, parents and children in online safety. Their aim is to make the internet a safer place for children and it achieves this by equipping school staff, parents and children with the knowledge they need to understand online dangers and how best to react should an incident arise.

Every week, National Online Safety (NOS) produce informative posters highlighting a specific online item. This week they have mentioned the online game 'Among Us'.

Anti-bullying

During the last academic year we took part in the All Together scheme, an antibullying programme run by the Anti-Bullying Alliance. As part of the programme, Key Stage 2 pupils were asked to complete an online questionnaire about their experiences at school and then an action plan was developed to deal with the issues that arose from this. The children responded brilliantly and, despite us having to stop midway through due to the lockdown, we are delighted to say that we have received a silver award which can now be displayed in school and on the website. A huge thank you and well done to all of the children - keep up the great work!

Nursery and 30hrs Bubble Group (Dakar)

We have had a fantastic week learning about spiders in Nursery and some children even brought a spider into school! The craft activities shown here were very popular and show how hard the children had to concentrate to thread the pipe cleaners or sprinkle the glitter during those activities - this is handwriting practise -Nursery Style!













The children also developed their physical skills as they climbed through the elastic spider's web outside. It was great fun... but quite tricky!

The children enjoyed the Autumn sunshine whilst painting and decorating an array of autumn leaves. We spoke about how the leaves fall from the trees during Autumn and that they return by re-growing again in the Spring.





We also had lots of fun in the Autumn leaves and making fireworks in a jar with Miss Orwin!






Year 1 Bubble Group (Seoul)

Year 1 have been creating bonfire night pictures with oil pastels and chalks. We used white chalk to create the skyline and then lots of bright oil pastels to create the fireworks in the night sky – great work everyone, they look amazing!



Year 1 have enjoyed an Art lesson based on the artist Piet Mondrian. They used squares and rectangles to replicate his work. They made sure they didn't overlap and really thought about how they were going to place them on the paper.








In Computing, the children enjoyed improving their keyboard skills. They had to find all the letters of the alphabet and then press the letter on the rockets to make them explode! It was very challenging as the children had to find and recognise where all the letters on the key board were. They will continue to develop this skill next week.

In Maths, they have been looking at number sentences and writing them very neatly in their books. It was really important they formed their numbers correctly and kept one number per square. The children learnt where to put the 'addition' and 'equals' sign correctly in the sentence. Well done year 1!





Year 1 Star of the week: Cole for a fantastic attitude to learning, always trying his best, being polite and being a great role model to the rest of the class!

Year 2 Bubble Group (Wellington)



The children started the week with completing Maths assessments that showcased their learning from last half term. They have completed some Maths investigations, including different ways to make 20 and finding answers to create a bonfire mosaic.





In English, they listened to the traditional tale of the Three Little Pigs and created a story board. They found out the text for this half term is 'The real story of the Three Little Pigs' and will get to know the story from the wolf's point of view!

In Topic, they thought of questions that they would like to find out about Winston Churchill and started learning about why this famous man is so well known. They are excited to learn more about him and find out more about the Second World War.






On Thursday, the children used oil pastels to create their own firework scene.



In Science, they began learning about animals including humans and found out about animals that lay eggs compared to animals that give birth to their young.





In Science, they will continue to learn about animals having offspring which grow into adults and learn about how they grow and change.

Year 2 Star of the week: Zach B for showing his working out when answering questions!


Year 3 Bubble Group (Zagreb)

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This week Zagreb class have returned to their learning and have settled back in so well. It is clear they were ready to continue stretching their brains! In English they have started a new book; The Iron Man and really enjoyed making a class robot on Monday. They have used their prediction skills by looking at the front cover of the book to see what the story might be about and have worked hard to learn and include similes in their descriptions.



In Maths they have shown great resilience this week learning how to use column subtraction with 3-digit numbers, both with exchanging and without - I am very proud of them!






In Clarborough curriculum, they have investigated what magnets are and they have enjoyed exploring the classroom to find what magnets are around us. They have also created some fantastic firework pictures.

Next week in English, Zagreb class will be writing complex sentences to describe a setting. In Maths, they will be looking at problem solving and reasoning questions linked to subtraction. In Clarborough curriculum, they will be exploring layers of the earth and how forces have pushes and pulls.


Year 3 Star of the week: Beatrice for persevering and having the confidence to complete her online learning!

Year 4 Bubble Group (Riga)

This week in Year 4, we have been learning about the digestive system and the names of all of the parts of the body involved in the process. They used the Popplet app on the iPads to work through the order in which the food travels through each organ. Watch this space for some messy experiments next week!



In Maths, the children have been ordering and comparing numbers and enjoyed using the dice to compete with a partner. They had to use 4, 5 and 6 digit numbers as well as challenge themselves with decimals. They had to think very carefully on their turn, deciding where to place their digit so that they could have the larger number. Mrs Garton tried her hardest but luck wasn't on her side – Logan managed to beat her on this one!



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In PE, the children took part in problem solving activities - trying to get the ball from one end of the playground to the other using the large tubes. This involved a lot of teamwork and communication skills and Year 4 smashed it!








This half term, Caracas Class have begun learning about Animals & Living Things as part of their Science topic. They have learned about the 6 different stages of human life and about the growth in size of babies.






As our Maths this week has covered statistics, they have created their own bar graphs using a variety of information, including the height of babies.

Our class book for this half-term is 'Charlotte's Web' by E.B.White and we are very fortunate to have multiple copies to use in the classroom. They are really enjoying reading aloud alongside each other as we enjoy this classic children's book. Our GPS focus has been on modal verbs so they have used modal verbs and adverbs effectively to make predictions about what they think will happen to the characters.

Although, they have only had 5 spelling words to learn this week, these subject-specific words link to our Science and the children have used a variety of strategies to support them in remembering how to spell them. Rainbow spelling is one of our favourites!




Year 5 Star of the week: Jenson for the huge pride he takes in the presentation of his work!
