#### New Classrooms

Next week, Nottinghamshire County Council will be submitting a planning application with regard to our school. The Local Authority has taken the decision to apply to build two new classrooms for the school, which would 'bolt-on' to the existing building, attaching to the Foundation Unit end of the building.

These new classrooms would allow pupils currently taught in two corridors (Year 1 & 4) to have a dedicated, purpose-built space for their learning. The intention of this project is to improve the learning experience for two year groups in our school and allow other pupils and staff the freedom to move around the building without disrupting teaching.

Whilst the number of full-time pupils in our school has increased significantly over the last eight years, the space available has become increasingly problematical. This extension would alleviate this.

During the build, we would expect there to be increased activity and noise around school but we have been assured by the Local Authority that if the planning permission is granted, the impact will be minimised as much as possible. They will also ensure that the site is secure and regular risk assessments are undertaken.

Details of this application will be available once the consultation process commences.

We are sure you will agree that this is a very exciting proposal for our school and should it go ahead, will further improve the provision that we can offer the children at Clarborough Primary School.

# Operation Christmas Child - Gift Suggestions

# Toys

Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls or stuffed toys (with CE label), toy trucks, harmonica, yo-yo, skipping rope, ball, small puzzles etc.

# School Supplies

Pens, pencils & sharpeners, crayons or felt pens, stamps & ink pad sets, writing pads or notebooks & paper, solar calculators, colouring & picture books etc.

# Hygiene Items

Toothbrush and toothpaste, bars of wrapped soap, comb or hairbrush, flannel.

#### Other Items

Hat, cap, gloves or scarf, sunglasses, hair accessories, jewellery set, wind up torch, wrapped sweets (best-before-date must be at least March of the following year).

#### Do Not Include

Used or damaged items, war related items such as toy guns, play soldiers or knives; chocolate or other food items; liquids or lotions of any type including bubbles; medicines; hand-made or knitted stuffed toys; anything of a political, racial or religious nature; sharp objects; glass containers, mirrors or fragile items; playing cards of the 4-suit variety; clothing other than as listed above.
