Dear Parents and Carers,

As mentioned last week, we have been asked to prepare for the phased re-opening of the school by the 1st June at the earliest. Initially this will be for children in Nursery, FS2, Year 1 & Year 6 only, whilst also continuing to provide childcare for the children of keyworkers.

A letter has been sent out to the parents of children in these year groups as well as our keyworker parents, detailing the protocols that we have put in place to ensure that we keep our pupils and children safe, whilst also meeting the Government requirements.

In addition for those children returning to school, we will be sending out a questionnaire through ParentMail to find out about these children's experiences during lockdown, in order to prepare as fully as possible for their return and ensure that we can give these children the best support we can.

As the new school arrangements will be very different to the school experience before lock down, we have also prepared a handbook for parents and carers that summarises how the new systems will work and we will be uploading a video to Seesaw so that children can see how things will look differently to the school that they left in March.

We are asking all parents of children who are returning to school to ensure that they firstly complete the ParentMail form to indicate whether they will be sending in their child, secondly complete the lockdown experience questionnaire when it becomes available and then lastly, complete the activity that is in the handbook that will be distributed, to help prepare their children for their return to school on the 1st June.

As I am sure you will appreciate, this is new and unknown territory for us all. We are trying to meet the needs of our school community, whilst also ensuring that we keep our pupils and staff as safe as possible. I think however that it is important to point out that whilst taking these precautions and implementing these protocols reduces the risk to staff and pupils, we cannot completely negate them.

Please also be assured that we will continue to support our children who remain at home by providing learning resources on the Seesaw platform supported by a Virtual Learning Team — children have received a video about this on Seesaw to explain the arrangements so far for this from their teacher. We will also be thinking of creative solutions to assist those children in Y6 who do not return to school so that they are able to feel that they are prepared for transition to Secondary and have the 'leavers' experience that they deserve. We will also allow sufficient time and support to our Nursery children who do not return to school to ensure a successful transition in to full time education whenever they return.



It's wonderful to see how enthusiastic the children are and how their skills are developing despite being away from school, friends and extended family.





Enjoy the half term break and we look forward to being in touch with you all, either in school or on Seesaw from June 1st!

Part of their learning in English has been about foxes where they wrote a mini fact file and had a go at drawing Fantastic Mr Fox from our class story.








Lots of children had a go at this week's Science experiment to get water to bend using static from a plastic comb!

Miss Green is very proud of the effort that everybody has put in this week.






Schwartz children

In English, the children have listened to the story of Tabby McTat and created a missing cat poster. There were some lovely pictures of Tabby Mctat!





Tchaikovsky class you've all worked incredibly hard this week and I'm so proud of you all!




Star of the week: Luke O
