



Young Voices - Tuesday 9th January 2024



Clarborough Primary School will be attending the Young Voices concert at Sheffield Utilita Arena on Tuesday 9th January 2024. Children from KS2 can attend this popular concert, which is the largest school choir in the UK. We have a maximum of 40 places available. Tickets are still available on Parentmail under Payments and Shop.

The cost per child is £15.00 and this will cover the cost of the coach to and from the venue and a registration fee. We will leave school at 12.15pm to arrive for our afternoon rehearsal and evening performance. The performance should finish around 8.45pm and the coach will then bring the children back to school. If you are attending the concert to watch your child, you will have to collect your child/ren from the venue. They will not return back to school on the coach.

Parents will be able to park at the venue (if you wish to attend the concert) and watch your child/ren. You can attend and watch the performance at Sheffield Utilita Arena. Tickets are priced at £23.00 each and are available to buy on Parentmail. The concert will take place from 7pm until 8.45pm. Tickets should be bought through Parentmail. Tickets purchased through school will be seated together and are usually easily visible to the choir. The deadline for us to be able to order your tickets is **Friday 7th July**.

There is the option of purchasing a Young Voices t-shirt and torch pack priced at £15. Alternatively, children will be able to wear a plain white top and dark trousers/leggings or skirt.

Reception: Mary Anning Class




This week in Mary Anning class we have been learning about cafes and how important it is for cooks and chefs to keep their kitchens and themselves clean so that they don't spread germs. We have also looked at how foods change when they are cooked and why it is important to make sure that our food is cooked properly so that it is safe to eat. The children have been taking part in balancing challenges to see if they could make a structure that could balance on their finger, or a toy that could balance without falling off. We have also been sorting odd and even quantities and have found out that

odd numbers can't be shared fairly between two groups.

Next week, we will be learning about churches; who works in them, who uses them and what they are used for.









Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class



This week, Year 1 have been making arrays and doubles in Maths and writing up their Titanic fact files in English. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been describing the experience of the Titanic passengers from different social backgrounds and in Computing, they have been adding narration using text and speech bubbles.

Next week, is Assessment week for Year 1.

Please note that Year 1 have creative homework in relation to their current topic of The Titanic. Mrs Deakin has popped information about this on your child's Seesaw account. Please refer to this and note that all projects need to be brought into school by Friday 7th July.

Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class



This week, Year 2 have been comparing weights and weighing in grams and kilograms in Maths. In English, they have been looking at features of a non-chronological report. The children have then been planning their own non-chronological report on hedgehogs. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 2 have been learning about Alexander Bell, the inventor of the telephone and in French, they have been consolidating their learning on animal names. In Computing, they have been learning to copy and paste an image into their eBook.

Next week, Year 2 will be looking at position and direction in Maths and writing up a recount of their visit to The Butterfly House.

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class

This week, Year 3 have been adding 3-digit numbers, ordering numbers, finding 1, 10 or 100 more/less than a number and adding/subtracting fractions. In English, the children have been finding subordinate clauses in a sentence and started to begin writing their own story about a fear using the prefix dis- and re-. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 have been looking at hills and mountains in the UK together with naming and locating areas of high ground. The children used maps to locate them. In Science, shadow puppets were created by the children and in Art they enjoyed sewing and

Next week, the children will be completing their assessments.







Year 4: Richard Leakey Class



In Maths this week, Year 4 have been covering a few things. They started by looking at the properties of 2d shapes by looking at how to identify and name the shapes from the number of sides, parallel lines and other criteria. Then they moved onto position and direction and then completed some reasoning and problem-solving questions involving coordinates.

In English, the children have started to look at the oral tradition of passing on information. We posed the question; 'Why are children

important?' The children are using their knowledge of persuasive techniques to create speeches to answer this question and tell us why children are so important to the future.

In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 4 began to look at the polar explorer, Shackleton. The children had to research him, his expedition, his ship, the event that happened and were asked to create a mini report about him.

In RE, they looked at the Christian representation of Jesus and how some images are very similar and others are very different. The children then created their own representation of Jesus and explained why he looked like what they had created.

In Science, the children deepened their understanding of how we see by creating diagrams of light coming from a light source, reflecting off an object and travelling into the eye and in Computing, they used Excel to create a database of mini beasts. In French they started to learn the story of the 'Three Little Bears' in French.

Next week, Year 4 will be looking at time and multi-step problems in Maths, continuing with their biographical writing on Shackleton and looking at the light spectrum in Science.












Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class




This week, Year 5 have been learning to read and plot coordinates and translate a shape in Maths. In English, they have been looking at and understanding the vocabulary associated with rivers, identifying word classes and learning to write a sentence using a subordinating conjunction. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been understanding the journey of a river and using knowledge of erosion and deposition to explain how a meander is formed. In Science, they have been investigating materials that will dissolve and in DT, they have

been learning to use a running stitch, backstitch and whipstitch and choosing the best one to use on their felt phone cases. In French, Year 5 have been asking for the bill and saying 'goodbye' and 'thank you.'


Next week is Assessment week and the Year 5 pupils will be completing English and Maths assessments. In Clarborough Curriculum, they will be understanding how rivers are used and who uses them and in Science, they will be using different processes to separate mixtures of materials. In DT, the children will be using a template to cut felt for their felt phone cases and begin to stitch them together and in Computing, they will search a database to find specific information.







Year 6: Alan Turing Class



This week the Year 6 children have been practising and preparing for their Year 6 Leavers Performance. They have been learning their lines, rehearsing their songs and making props for the show. The children helped the Year 1 children with their comic creations this week and in their Science lessons they looked at the fossilization process.

Next week, is Transition week and the Year 6 children will be visiting their secondary schools.


A big well done to Alana who received her 5m Rainbow Distance Certificate - Fantastic work Alana!
