Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have enjoyed the amazing weather we have had this week! As ever, school has been so busy this week and there's lots of information about the children's learning in this week's newsletter.

Over the last week, teachers have been busy finishing the children's school reports. These look a little bit different to the annual reports you usually receive and they focus specifically on the learning that your child had been doing before lockdown began. These will be ready for you on Friday 3rd July 2020. Distributing reports this year will also be different: you will be able to collect your child's report from the front entrance of school on Friday 3rd July from 10 am until 12 pm and from 1 pm until 3 pm. If your child is currently attending school, it can be collected from their class teacher at the end of the school day. Alternatively, reports can be posted.

I would like to remind you that the last day of the school term is on Tuesday 21st July 2020. School will then close for the summer holidays. It will also be closed during the summer for key worker children. The new academic year will begin on Wednesday 2nd September 2020.






On Tuesday, the children made stress balls! It was very exciting when the flour they were using exploded out of the deflating balloons!


We've also spent lots of time outdoors, making pictures with giant sticks, and keeping cool under the hosepipe!




This week the children have continued to enjoy their final few weeks at school. They brought their bikes/hover boards in again, got drenched by the hosepipe and had a water fight.


Nightingale Class

very interesting discussions at home!


As part of our work on adverts and logos this week, Isla O drew an amazing school logo – we couldn't agree more Isla!




It has been a fun week and Miss Mayhew is extremely proud of the fantastic work produced!



Jenner Class


