Dear Parents and Carers,

As you are aware, the forecast for next week's weather is extremely hot for Monday and Tuesday. There has been a red extreme heat warning issued for the first time and I wanted to explain what will be happening in school:



- Classrooms will be ventilated and blinds closed to block the heat
- Children will be encouraged to drink little and often throughout the day
- Electric fans will be in the classrooms
- PE sessions will not be taken outside
- A sprinkler will be on at regular points in the day to cool the children
- We will provide ice pops for the children

Your child should come to school in PE kit as normal on Monday and Tuesday. They need to wear sunscreen and should bring a sun hat. If there is any further information or I receive guidance from the DfE, I will of course update you.

Unfortunately, we have been contacted by the companies that have supported us with our recycling of cans and crisp packets. We have been informed that it is no longer viable for them to recycle from schools so the schemes have now stopped. Please do not send any more cans or crisp packets into school as we are not able to send these on for recycling. We are still able to recycle pens, batteries and printer cartridges.

During the short periods outside, the children have made up simple games of making repeating patterns which involved them only stepping on certain shapes - great for their physical development as well as their mathematical awareness.

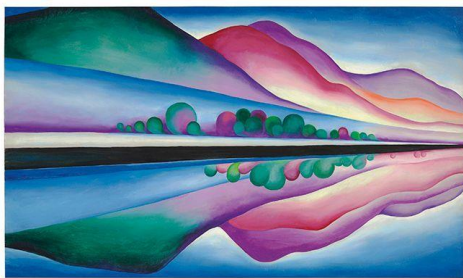


The children also enjoyed playing in their outside kitchen and 'cooking up' some amazing meals!

Next week, we will be learning all about pirates, finishing with a dressing-up Pirate Day on Friday - be prepared to walk the plank and shiver your timbers!

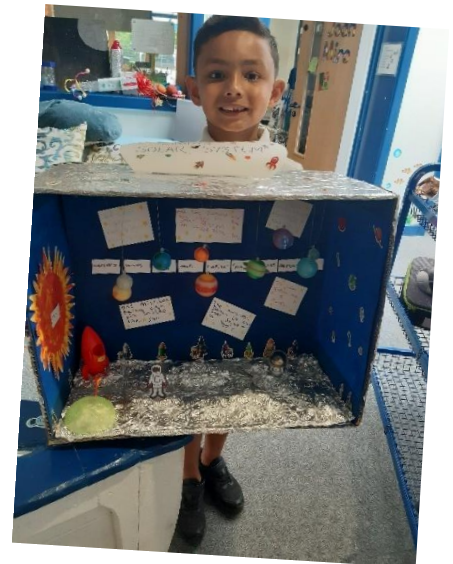

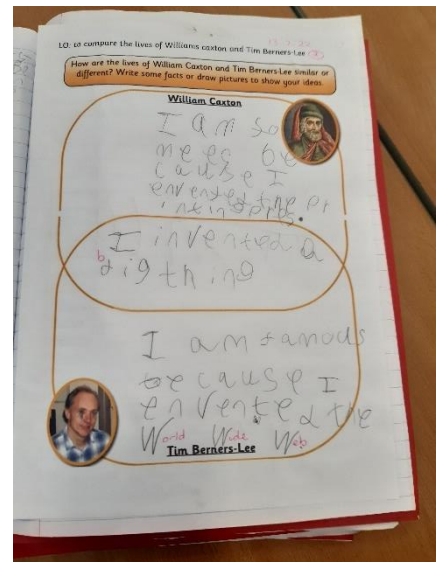
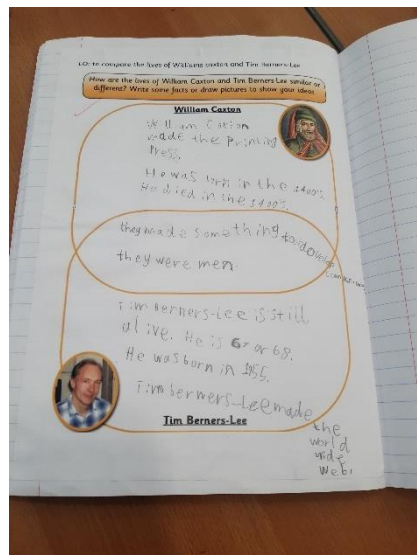

Next week, they are planning and preparing for their teddy bears' picnic and they will be completing their 'Show me what you know' about the world wide web.

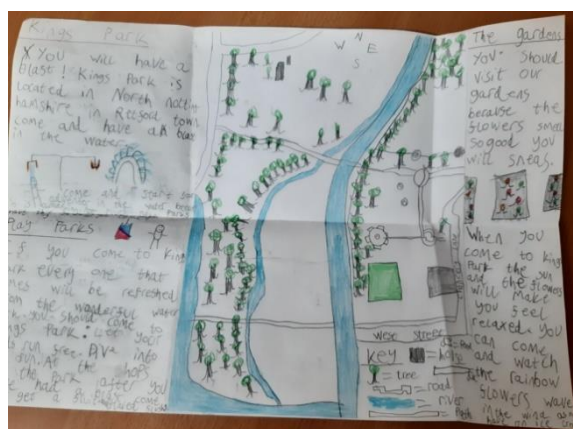


Star of the week: Ben for trying really hard with his behaviour and learning!

Next week, Year 3 will be completing their 'Show me what you know' on their mapping skills and will be creating an animation.



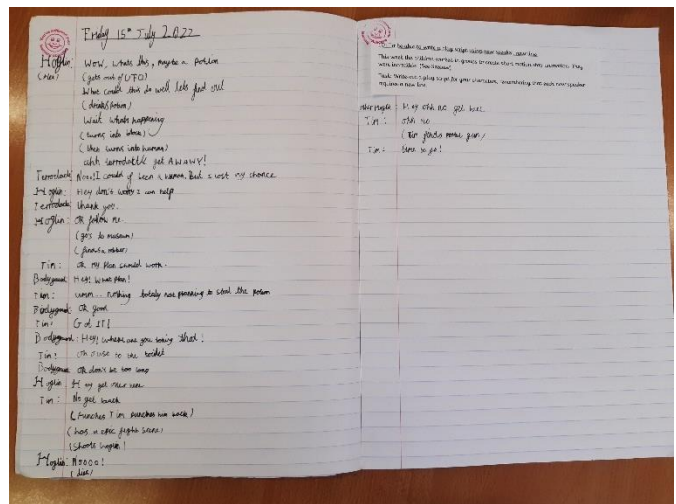
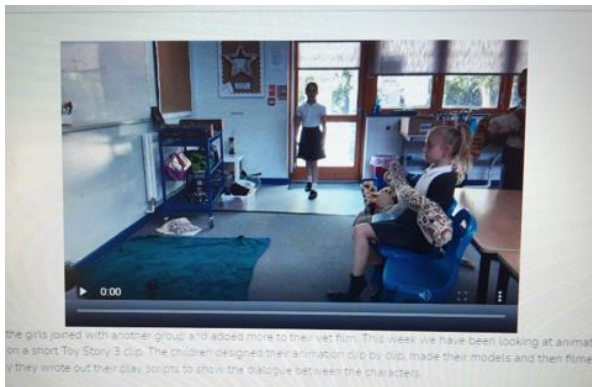
Stars of the week: Maisie-Lou for her outstanding assessment results. You have worked so hard and with so much dedication – Well done!

Next week, Year 4 will be creating a Van Gough-style project for the hall.

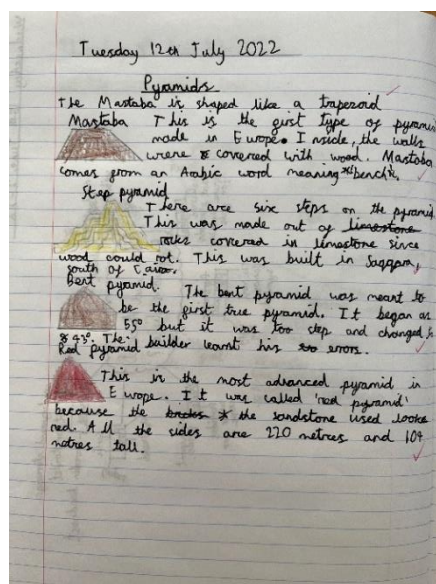
