Sports Presentation Evening

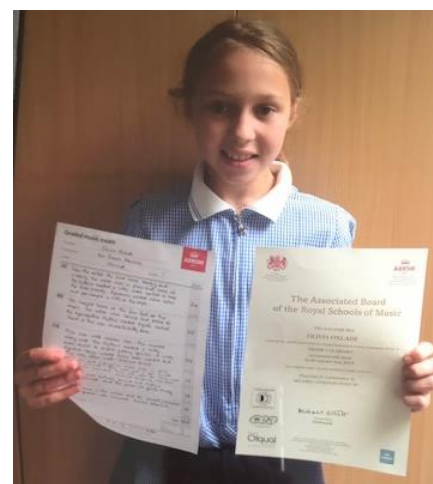
