

Thanks to Seesaw and our amazing parents and children, the learning doesn't stop just because we are self-isolating!


This week's theme of journeys by air continued and the children made some amazing airports with anything they could find at home.









The children also created shapes using items they could find around their homes.

Mrs Turton's children packed their suitcases and flew off to all kinds of imaginary places!
















Plus, some of the children in Reception have been mastering odd and even numbers.

<u>Literacy</u>

The children have made a really good start on writing their fact files this week.

We have broken down our fact file quite a lot to ensure we have quality writing. The children have been so excited by our topic so it is taking us a while to complete it! We are really pleased with how well the children are using the facts they have found out to write full sentences in their report.


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We are hoping to finish them by next week and we will then move on to learning about how to write a diary entry. We would like the children to imagine they were on the Titanic and produce a diary telling us about their experience.

<u>Maths</u>

This week in Maths we have been carrying out some assessments to see where the children are in their learning and to find out the children's next steps. They have all worked really well in completing the activities to the best of their ability and we are very proud of them. We have also been embedding our learning around place value and showing how many tens and ones a number has.


On Monday, we begin looking at recognising coins and the value of coins. The children had fun placing the coins under their paper and rubbing a crayon to see the pattern come through the paper.



Next week, we are also going to be moving forward with place value and beginning to look at numbers up to 100, as well as continuing with money. It would be great if you could practise counting up to 100, and begin looking at and recognising coins with your child at home.

Art

Over the last few weeks the children have been designing their own Titanic ship and this week they have used the clay to make a replica of the ship. The children had lots of fun and thought really carefully about the shapes they needed and how they would represent the different parts of the ship.

Year 2 Bubble Group (Wellington)



Maths

In Maths this week the children used the column method to subtract 2-digit numbers. They understood the need to exchange ten for ten ones. They completed further assessments to showcase their learning from this half term.

Next week, the children will describe movement. They will use mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement in a straight line and distinguish between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles.

English/SPAG

This week the children added the suffixes -ful and -less to make adjectives. They looked at a range of words including those where the spelling changes, for example 'penny - penniless'. They chose adjectives and were able to use these within a sentence.

Next week, they will plan and write a diary entry before starting a new unit on 'writing instructions.' They will begin by following a series of instructions and effectively give oral instructions in the correct sequence.



Science

In Science, the children checked in with their experiment and were surprised to see how quickly the sunflower without sunlight was growing and that it was colourless!

We will review the experiment next week. They also learnt about life cycles, including animals and plants and created their own life cycle of a sunflower.



Next week, the children will describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy by comparing the growth of our seedlings in different conditions.

This week the children found out about the invention of the telegraph and Morse code. They looked at the ways people sent messages and post to each other before telegraphs. They learnt about Morse code and translated simple words.

Next week, we will find out who Alexander Graham Bell was and what he invented.

Art

On Thursday, the children looked at the sculptor Marc Quinn. They followed instructions to make their own bread dough and, after leaving it to prove over lunch, created their own bread sculpture. Although tempting to eat, the children will coat their bread sculptures in PVA glue to preserve them.

Next week, we will learn about the sculptor, Barbara Hepworth.



RE

During our weekly RE session, the children joined in with re-telling the story 'The Lost Sheep' to understand key beliefs about God, love and forgiveness. They actively took part in the story and considered if Jesus was similar to the shepherd. It was interesting to hear who would have gone to similar lengths to find the lost sheep! Next week, the children will learn about special beliefs that Jewish people have and relate key stories in Judaism to their own lives.

The children also enjoyed practising for Sports Day and showed a fantastic team spirit!





Year 3 Bubble Group (Zagreb)

This week Zagreb class have been working incredibly hard in their Maths, Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling assessments.


In Clarborough Curriculum, they have been learning all about maps. The children have enjoyed using Digimaps (an online map source) and nave learnt all about Keys and how they help us to understand what is present

on different maps.



They initially had a map of Clarborough and located different places of significance to us; our school, a house, a shop, trees, roads, a river and a railway. They could then choose their own map using either Brazil, Mexico, Croatia or the United Kingdom and used a Key to identify points on their maps to complete their tasks.

The children also enjoyed exploring the 4 compass points by navigating each other around the playground using specific instructions. Finally, they learnt how to work out where places are using letter and number coordinates to be able to mark boundaries on their scaled drawings. Amazing work Zagreb class!



In French, the children have loved learning all about numbers. They now know how to count to twenty and they have learnt how to include 'how old are you?' with a response into their French conversations.

This week, I also had the opportunity to supervise them during their swimming lessons. It was fantastic to see how far they have come and how enthusiastic they all were. I was super proud of them all!

Next week, in Maths, the children will be exploring mass and learning how to make accurate calculations.

In English they will be spotting features within poems with the aim of writing their own poem based on light.

In Clarborough Curriculum, the children will be investigating how light is needed to be able to see things and how it reflects from different surfaces.

In PSHE, they will also be discussing the importance of hygiene and methods we take to stay hygienic.



Year 4 Bubble Group (Riga)



This week Year 4 have been amazing, and been so mature during their assessments. They have worked very hard, and shown us exactly what they are capable of. Well done Year 4, yet again you have shown real maturity and produced some excellent work!

In English this week they have produced some brilliant diary entries based on the book 'Shackleton's Journey'. The children challenged themselves to use ambitious vocabulary and included lots of technical sentence structures independently. Your writing is really impressive Year 4 and you should be very proud of yourselves!

The children had a great afternoon this week, taking part in the Engineering Project. The children had to think like an electrical engineer and create a circuit for their magic wands. The children worked well together helping each other out and making sure they had connected them up correctly. The wands looked brilliant in the end, fully decorated and with a working light! Magical work Year 4!







Next week:

In Maths, the children will be completing their final week on fractions and in English, we will be beginning a new topic on 'Speech' and taking a closer look at the 'Send My Friend to School' campaign. The children will look at how many children are still out of education around the world, due to the effects of Covid, and what the Government can do to support this.



Year 5 Bubble Group (Caracas)




This week, pupils have been busy completing their English and Maths assessments, which were first completed on their return to school in March. Everyone has worked extremely hard and made excellent progress in such a short space of time.

As part of our Clarborough Curriculum, the children have looked at erosion and deposition in the river system. They learnt that erosion is when the water wears away the land in a particular area and deposition is the depositing of stones etc. at certain points along a river, creating new areas of land. They also learned how oxbow lakes are formed.



Our Raising Aspirations session, focused on transferable skills and they played a game that involved matching skills to different jobs. The children then thought about their own dream jobs and the skills and qualities they would need to be successful in this role.



On Friday, we participated in this years' Sports Day, which although slightly different to usual, was a huge success. Check out Seesaw to see the races and the winners!

Next week in Maths, pupils will work on time, an area identified as one which the majority find particularly difficult.

In English, they will look at the use of apostrophes for possession, again an area identified from assessments as needing revisiting and consolidation.

Raising Aspirations focuses on highlighting various jobs within different sectors and exploring pathway options.

Our geographical learning will concentrate on being able to describe and explain the ways in which rivers are used.

We will also have a DT focus next week as we catch up on our learning about seasonal food and a healthy diet.

Year 6 Bubble Group (Havana)




This week has been a little different for the children in Havana Class.

We moved some of our normal lessons over to next week to make way for our assessments and I have been so impressed with the maturity and confidence with which the children approached their assessments this week.

In addition to the assessments, we completed our final DARE lesson. During this lesson we completed our final DARE report, learnt the DARE song and created some art pieces to show in our DARE graduation next week.

We also completed our non-chronological dragon reports and I was blown away by the quality of the writing.



Next week, we are going to be catching up on some of the things that were put on hold by assessment week.

We will begin our poetry genre looking in particular at the two poems 'The Sound Collector' and 'The Magic Box'.

We will be looking at all things data related in Maths and we will even be introducing the never analysed before pie chart.

In our other lessons, we will be looking at harmful substances and the effect they can have on our bodies and relationships, continuing to look at the effect of human interference in certain animal species across the planet, delving deeper into what faith means and how this can be demonstrated by a person's actions and looking at Celtic home life and making some ancient style thumb pots.

Along with all of this is, of course, the genius which is Glockband rocking out every Wednesday with Mrs Cowell-Clark.
