St Swithun's Christmas Tree Festival

Our tree is up and awaiting visitors! Thank you to the children in breakfast club and sewing club as well as Mrs Bennett, Mrs Osborn, Mrs Hardie and Mrs Herdman for making the fabulous decorations. The festival runs from Saturday 30th November to Saturday 7th December.





Foundation children will be talking about the differences that we see in our homes, Clarborough and Retford at Christmas, e.g. lights, decorations and trees.

We will also be learning about the Nativity story and acting it out.

In maths we will be finding out about 1 more.

Class 1 will begin practicing for 'Christmas around the world'.

In Maths, they will consolidate knowledge of subtraction and apply this to fact families.

Throughout their English lessons they will begin planning and writing a diary extract from 'The tin forest' exploring how the old man feels living with all the rubbish.

Class 2 children will be predicting what will happen next in a story using clues from what they have already read in English. The children will also learn about the past and present tense and learn to use the tenses correctly.

In maths the children will continue to add and subtract two two-digit numbers. They will look for pairs of numbers that make 100 and also learn to add 3 one-digit number efficiently. The children will be taught to look for quick ways to add the numbers like looking for doubles or pairs that make 10.

In the afternoons we are excited to start rehearsing the Christmas play.

Class 3 will be learning the 4 times table and using visual representations to help.

In English, they will be continuing their learning on The Tin Forest.

In Topic, they will be researching animal and plant life cycles and considering what our world will look like in the future.

Class 4 children will be learning how to problem solve using the column written method for subtraction during their maths lessons.

They will also be completing their eBooks, finding facts about orangutans and why they're endangered.

Class 5 are learning to: measure and calculate the area and perimeter of shapes in cm and m; plan an explanation text linked to night and day; and use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain night and day in Science.

Class 6 will be consolidating their understanding of fractions in Maths and in English they will be furthering their comprehension of a range of texts.

Christmas gifts
