Dear Parents and Carers,

As you know from the announcement on Sunday, the Government have stated that they want to get children back into education as soon as the scientific advice allows. As part of this strategy, primary schools are to welcome back children in **Nursery**, **FS2**, **Year 1 and Year 6** as well as continuing to provide childcare for **vulnerable children and children of critical workers** as we have done since the end of March.

I have begun to plan and prepare for this and hope you can appreciate that there are many aspects to it and a lot of guidance to consider. I have sent a questionnaire to parents and carers of children in Nursery, FS2, Year 1 and 6 to gauge an estimate of how many children might return. I would like to thank you for your responses and the conversations I have had with some of you about this. This is a decision that has to be made by each family to take into account their personal circumstances, opinions about the COVID situation and work/ care commitments. It is different for everyone and a personal choice.

In the coming weeks I will send out more information about how school will be organised, including the curriculum, organisation of the school day, online learning and the challenges of social distancing, especially with young pupils.

If you have any questions regarding the school re-opening, please call or email the office and I will get back to you.



The children played wonderfully together, building dens playing makebelieve games and even some tennis!




They ended the busy day with a nice relaxing film....



They listened to the story 'It's not a box' and had to design something special for their 'not a box'.









They had a very funny day telling lots of jokes as part of their well-being challenge!

They have also enjoyed carrying out different science experiments, here are some below.














#### Williams
