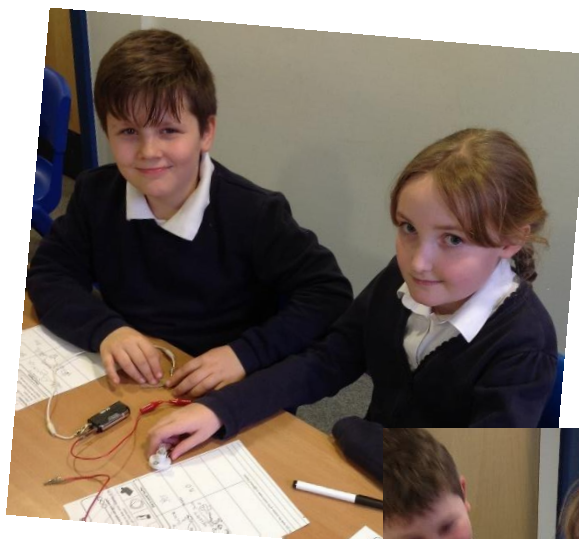
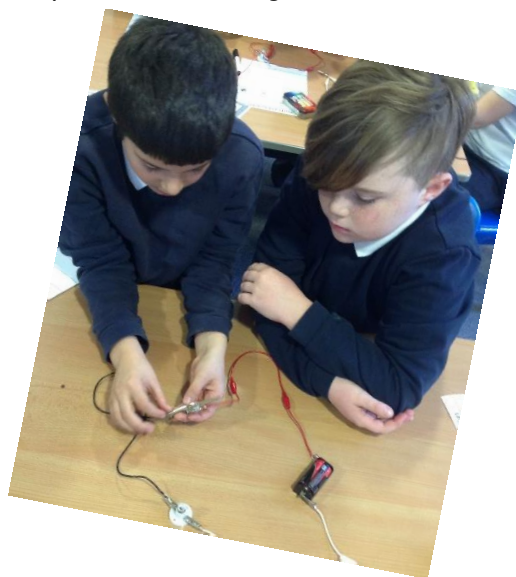
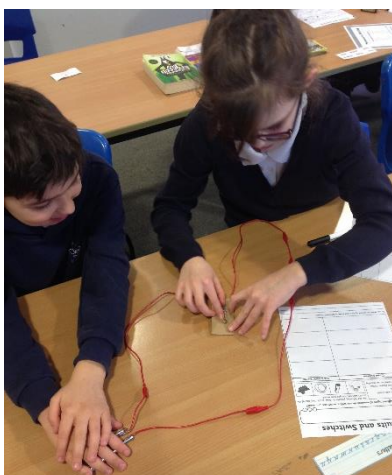
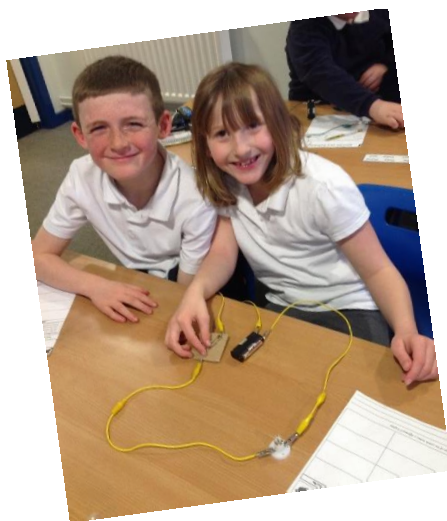


### Class 4

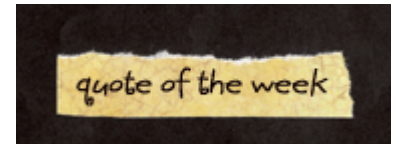
## Dance Taster Sessions
