## Reception (Georgia O'Keeffe)



Next week, we will be learning about space vehicles and, because it is Sports Day, we will be talking about being a good sport and why exercise is so important to keep us healthy.









Stars of the week: Harry G for the huge progress he has made in his reading and writing this year and Charlie for working so hard in Phonics and for being so kind and helpful!




## Year 2 (L.S. Lowry)



This week the children have been reading the story 'When Charlie McButton Lost His Power.' They have been focusing on the vocabulary used in the story and written sentences containing adverbs. In Maths, they have been comparing temperatures and capacities. They have also been looking at the invention of the telegraph, using Morse code to communicate and creating their own code system.







Next week, the children will be looking at telling the time to five minutes in Maths. They will be continuing with the Charlie McButton story and they will also be finding out about Alexander Graham Bell and what he invented. In Art, they will be comparing the work of L. S. Lowry.


#### Year 3 (William Morris)

Next week, the children will be looking at horizontal lines and drawing shapes accurately. In English they will be finding out more about the future tense and in Science, they are going to find out how to make












## Year 4 (Salvador Dali)

Next week, the children will be creating nets for 3-D shapes and calculating angles in Maths. They will be using adjectives in their writing and clay to make models for cartoons.










## **Year 6 (Lucian Freud)**
