Dear Parents and Carers,

Well, we've had sunshine and snow this week while enjoying the transformation in our playground. Pentagon Play have finished replacing the soft pour with Astroturf and we are thrilled with the results!





As you are aware, national free COVID testing ends today. LFT testing will now stop in school and we will no longer be asking for your child to take LF tests if they are unwell. We will continue to monitor attendance and should there be an increase in absences in pupils or staff, any severe illness that requires hospitalisation or there is a cluster of suspected cases, I will inform the Public Health team, in line with Local Authority guidance.

During April, the NHS will be offering vaccinations for children aged 5 to 11 years. You will be able to make appointments for this yourself, booking online. Vaccinations will take place at local vaccination centres, a local pharmacy or through your GP. To be clear, vaccinations <u>WILL NOT</u> be administered at school.







Star of the week: All of Year 3 for their hard work in their assessments!






Year 6 (Lucian Freud)


A big well done to Esmay who received her Puffin Certificate and Learn to Swim Stage 1 Award in swimming this week – Great work Esmay!
