
The first Christingle was made in 1747 and the German people created it. We really enjoyed Reverend Mark coming in and teaching us all about Christingle.

Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 Nativity rehearsals

Play rehearsals have been in full swing this week and it is starting to come together!

Key Stage 1 children are working very hard and can't wait to perform at the church next Friday and in school the week after.

Next week is:

Foundation will be continuing to talk about the Nativity story, before performing our own Nativity show for our parents. We will also be talking about our family's Christmas traditions and the similarities and differences between the ways we celebrate, before ending the week with our Christmas party!

Class 1 children will be working independently, as their knowledge in reading, writing and maths is assessed. The children will also follow instructions to plant a seed and the rehearsals will continue in preparation for the nativity performances.

Class 2 are having assessment week next week. This is nothing for the children or you to worry about but a good practise of answering questions in test conditions. The results will inform planning for next term. We will continue to practise the Christmas play ready for our first performance in Church on Friday (2pm). In our environmental work the children will consider what we can do to protect the environment such as recycling and saving water.

Class 3 will be learning about natural disasters during topic work; including earthquakes and volcanoes, and exploring how and why they occur. On Thursday, they will be performing their class assembly, they hope you can join them to celebrate their knowledge and understanding of the environment.

In Maths they have moved on to the 4 x table and will continue to use their taught methods. In English they will be focusing on their speaking and listening skills through the use of scripts and role play.

Class 4 will be adding sound, text and maps to their orangutan Ebooks.

The children are looking forward to showcasing their class assembly.

Class 5 will be consolidating their learning in English and Maths, including using the short film Trailblaizer in Space to practice their reading comprehension skills. They will complete their learning about Earth and Space in Science by describing the movement of the moon relative to Earth.

Class 6 will be challenging themselves by applying their learning so far. We will also be learning more about the environment.

The school choir will be singing at the Stocking Filler Market in Retford at 4.30pm. We hope you can join us.





Wednesday 11th

Year 6 will be attending the Queen Elizabeth's High School in Gainsborough's production of Aladdin. A couple of our former pupils will be performing in the pantomime so it will be great to watch them.

The Foundation Stage children will be performing their Nativity on this day. Parents and carers of Reception children can watch at 9.30am and parents and carers of Nursery children can watch at 10.45am.

Thursday 12th sees Classes 3 & 4 performing their assembly for parents and carers to watch. This will be in the school hall and starts at 3pm. The children will be showcasing what they have learnt during this terms topic of the environment.

Friday 13th

This is Christmas Jumper Day. Children can wear non-uniform with any kind of Christmas jumper or t-shirt. Please ensure they are dressed warmly for playing outside. Any £1 donations made will be sent to Save the Children.

The Foundation children will be having their Christmas party today. They are welcome to come to school in party clothes.

Key Stage 1 children will be performing their Nativity in Clarborough church at 2pm. Tickets are not needed for this event.

Christmas gifts
