Forest School Club



STEM Fair at QEHS



Nursery and 30hrs (Frida Kahlo)




Another fantastic week of learning in Nursery! This week we have been thinking about frogs and other pondlife. The children have been exploring how to draw frogspawn and tadpoles and as you can see here they have done fantastically well!







We have also had a lot of fun hiding eight frogs each day and the children have become adept at finding them in all kinds of weird and wonderful places, as well as counting them up as they find them.







I have been so proud my how much they have learnt with this topic and next week we finish it with farm animals.



Reception (Georgia O'Keeffe)

This week we have been learning about animals that live underground and the names of their homes. We have also been talking about what plants, animals and people need to grow. We have looked for signs of spring and noticed the changes that have been happening to the bulbs that the children planted last year... there are lots of beautiful daffodils, crocus and hyacinths growing.





The children have applied their knowledge of repeating pattern to make 'coding worms' - a practical way to practice coding for computing! They have also enjoyed using very tiny paintbrushes to paint carefully and have used special colouring pencils that turn into paint when water is brushed over them.

Finally, lots of the children have helped Mrs Turton to create a garden centre role play area for us to use next week and they did an amazing job!

Next week, we will be learning about farm animals and continuing to talk about the signs of spring and how things change as they grow.





After School Club Assistant

We wish to appoint an After School Club Assistant to assist the After School Club Supervisor in the management of wraparound care from April 2022 to July 2022 initially.

It is anticipated that the successful candidate will be offered a NJC Grade 1 salary, although this is currently subject to job evaluation, with the actual rate of pay being confirmed at interview.

The post will require the post holder to work for 8 hrs per week and will be required to work for 39 weeks of the year, (covering term time only).

The club runs from 3:30pm - 5:30pm, Monday to Thursday and is based in the main hall at Clarborough Primary School. Children who attend the club are offered a snack which is prepared by the After School Club Supervisor and Assistant.

The After School Club Assistant will work together with the After School Club Supervisor to ensure the safety, general welfare and proper conduct of pupils during this period, supervising snacks and engaging children in a range of activities which will be based on play and relaxation, not school work.

Retford residents will once again be showing solidarity and support for the people of Ukraine, with a Candlelit Vigil and fundraiser on Monday 21st March at Retford Town Hall.

They will be joined by local civic leaders, including the Mayor of Retford, Cllr Carolyn Troop and the Chair of the District Council, Cllr Jack Bowker.

Retford Town Centre Chaplin, the Rev David Bean will lead prayers for peace, before a minutes silence and contemplation.

The Ukrainian Flag will be then raised and flown from Retford Town Hall.

There will be a collection and cake sale in aid of the Support Ukraine UK campaign.

The event is led by Retford resident and business woman MariaPoala Ditch, who is the <u>Support</u>. <u>Ukraine UK</u> coordinator for Nottinghamshire.

Maria Ditch said:

"Retford stands with Ukraine! Our candlelit vigil is a way of showing solidarity and support for the people of Ukraine and raise money towards humanitarian supplies for those displaced by this horrific war. We will be sending pictures of the vigil and the Ukrainian flag flying from the Town Hall to friends and relatives in Ukraine and letting them know that we stand together."
