Dear Parents and Carers,

Over the last week, we have noticed a rise in cases of Covid across the school. These cases have been confirmed with tests and positive cases have had a variety of symptoms. With guidance changes, we are no longer required to report cases to the Local Authority or the Department for Education and this coincides with the requirement lifting for testing. As ever, the safety of all children and adults at school remains my priority so I would ask that the following guidance is taken should your child become ill:

If your child has a temperature or cough and they are feeling unwell, please keep them at home for three days or until you feel that they are well enough to return.

If your child is unwell and you have access to tests and are willing to test your child, please do. Sharing any positive cases with us allows us to keep a track on any spread around school.

Any child or adult who tests positive will be asked to stay at home for three days to reduce the spread.

Nursery and 30hrs (Frida Kahlo)






Star of the week: Lewis for being a good friend and for trying so hard with his writing!

Next week, Year 2 will be using position and direction in Maths and using left and right. They will be using expanded noun phrases in English and in Science, they are finding out about micro habitats.





Star of the week: Reiss for his fantastic writing about hedgehogs!

Next week, they are beginning biographies about Ernest Shackleton. They will be learning about volcanoes and finding out more about quadrilaterals.




Star of the week: Harriet because she has worked super-hard for two weeks now!


