Nursery and 30hrs: Percy Shaw Class



We have spent a lot of time in Nursery thinking about the Christmas story and practising for our play. Far from taking us away from our learning, this is a fantastic experience for children to learn about pretending, speaking clearly, singing new songs and learning actions. I am beyond proud of them already!



They are also loving drawing at the moment and our budding artists are inspiring everyone else! We've been thinking about houses and learning that we all have very different homes.

If you are struggling for a gift idea this Christmas, simple games like the lotto game (shown below) are wonderful to play with your child (Orchard Toys do a good range).

Next week, we are continuing with the Nativity story and things heat up as we approach Christmas!







Reception: Mary Anning Class



This week we have been thinking about our clothes and how we choose them according to the weather or the job that we are doing, or for special times like parties. We have talked about the way clothes can help to protect us, help us to be seen and keep us warm and dry.

We have been practising subitising (recognising amounts without counting them) by playing games with dice and have been identifying and sorting

shapes with 4 sides.

After listening to the story 'We're going on a bear hunt' the children have been making maps to show the way the characters went!

Mrs Turton has been especially proud of the children's writing and how independent they are becoming. Well done everyone!

Next week, we will be thinking about different types of food and will be focusing on the story of 'The very hungry caterpillar'.











Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class

This week in Maths, the children have been comparing lengths and heights. In English, they have been talking about their own shadow, creating a front cover for a book and writing rhyming poems. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have started to rehearse their Nativity and in Art they have created a Big Ben out of cardboard and discussed joining

techniques. In French, they have learnt to say 'how are you?' and in Computing, they have been learning about who to talk to if something is not right on the internet or on an electrical device. They have been transitioning from one shape to another in PE.

Next week, the children will be continuing to compare lengths and heights in Maths and they will be learning about prepositions in English. They will be talking about different ways to travel to school and in Science they will be using Lego. They will also be continuing their e-safety work in Computing and they will also learn how to say 'goodbye' in French.



Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class

In Maths, Year 2 have been adding numbers that cross into tens and using tally charts. In English they have been looking at plurals and adding suffixes to make them plural. They have also read the story 'My Shadow is Pink' and created their own shadow. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have been looking at healthy foods and creating a rainbow collage of healthy foods — they have also been discussing how food was rationed during World War 2. The children have been enjoying practising the Nativity and in Computing, they have made characters on Scratch. In French, they have been learning 'les couleurs'.

Next week, Year 2 will continue with their Nativity practise and they will be using descriptive writing about a magic door in English.

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class



In Maths this week, the children in Year 3 have been looking at multiplication and equal groups using arrays using the 2 times table. In English, they have read chapter 4 of 'The Iron Man' and found out the meaning of some words. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been taking part in a scrapyard challenge and produced some amazing creative homework! In Science, they have been grouping materials into magnetic and non-magnetic. In Art, Year 2 have been using tone to make objects look 3-D and in French, they have been listening to the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood'.

Next week, Year 3 will be revising the 5 times table and finding equal groups to divide by 2. In English, they will finish 'The Iron Man' story and then start their new text 'A Pebble in my Pocket.' In Clarborough

Curriculum they will be learning about earthquakes and how they are caused.

Don't forget there is an exhibition of the children's creative homework on Tuesday 29th November at 3.10pm – everyone is welcome!



Year 4: Richard Leakey Class



In Maths this week, the children have been using factors, short multiplication and solving problems using short multiplication. In English, they have been planning their narratives, describing a character, setting and using inverted commas. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 4 have been learning about controversy and LGBT+ issues as well as locating countries on a world map. In Science, they have been finding out about food chains and have also looked at the effect milk, Diet Coke, orange juice and vinegar has on egg shells (which

are very similar in structure to teeth). In French, they have been speaking in sentences and they have been creating e-book pages in Computing.

Next week, they will be using their reasoning skills to answer division problems in Maths. They will be drafting their narratives in English. They will be looking at the teeth of animals in Science and in Geography, they will be looking more at the North and South Pole. Finally, they will be looking at risks, hazards and dangers in PSHE.


Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class



In Maths, Year 5 have been multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000. In English, they have been discussing the controversy surrounding the World Cup in Qatar and also discussing the issues with LGBT+. In Science, the children have been looking at the different stages of pregnancy and in Computing, they have been continuing to add hyperlinks to their apps.

Next week, Year 5 will be finding equivalent fractions, writing a diary entry on 'Falling Angels', and continue to design their own apps. They will also be looking at ways of measuring growth in children.

Year 6: Alan Turing Class



This week, Year 6 have been simplifying fractions and finding equivalent fractions. In English they have been publishing their diaries in the style of Anne Frank and in Clarborough Curriculum, they have focused on Anne Frank's life and the Holocaust. In PSHE, the children have been looking at the book 'My Shadow is Pink.' In PE, they have been balancing and working with partners to balance on mats. In Science, Year 6 have been finding out how light helps us to see and in Computing, they have been finishing Icon work – graphic designing. In French, they have been learning the days and months of the year.

Next week, Year 6 will be adding and subtracting fractions and planning a story from a historical setting. They will be learning about the D-Day landings and in Science they will continue their work on light. In Art, they will be sketching using charcoal in the style of Henry Moore and in Computing, they will be using the Binary Code. In French, they will be continuing to practise days and months.

Local News



Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.
