Next week, we will be learning about old vehicles, and looking at how different types of transport have changed over time.





Year 2 (L.S. Lowry)






Year 3 (William Morris)

Next week, Year 3 will be looking at parallel lines and 2-D shapes. They will also be learning about the present perfect tense.











Year 4 (Salvador Dali)

about The Pilgrim Fathers. They will also be translating shapes in Maths and a self-portrait in Art.






