Year 1 Bubble Group (Seoul)

<u>Literacy</u>

In Literacy this week, Year 1 have been exploring a diary entry written by a young girl called Eva describing her experience of being on the Titanic. We have looked into how she felt at different stages of the journey and that dreadful night of the disaster. The children have created a word bank of feelings and have been using their knowledge of

the disaster and Eva's story to plan their own diary entry as if they were on the Titanic. We have looked at using conjunctions to extend our sentences and talked about writing in the first person because a diary entry is writing from the author's point of view and experience.

Maths

We have been spending lots of time on place value recently in Maths, getting the children familiar with numbers to 100. This week we have partitioned the numbers, ordered and found missing numbers to 100 using facts we know about numbers and we have been comparing numbers to 100. The children are starting to really shine in this area. It would be helpful if you could keep this going at home by counting to 100 in 1's, 2's, 5' and 10's. Try starting from different numbers not always 1 but from 34 forwards or 56 backwards etc.

Topic/Art

This week, the children have been learning how to use water colours. They have explored creating different shades of blue by mixing and have created a background to their picture. The children then created a picture of Titanic on top of their background. All the children worked really hard and had lots of fun!

Computing

The children's Computing topic this half term is 'Comic Creations.' The children have looked at some comics and identified their features. They then made their own Lego comics and included a background, characters and speech bubbles. We have been using a website called **Make Beliefs Comix.** This is free to use but does require a username and password. I will share this information on Seesaw so the children can continue their fantastic work at home!

We are all looking forward to our last week in Seoul class next week and cannot wait to celebrate with all the children who completed the reading challenge as well all of the other things that the children have achieved this year.

Year 2 Bubble Group (Wellington)



Maths

In Maths this week, the children used mathematical vocabulary to describe position, direction and movement and were able to distinguish between rotation as a turn and in terms of right angles for quarter, half and three quarter turns (clockwise and anticlockwise). They enjoyed using this vocabulary when programming the Bee-bots!

English/SPAG

This week, the children followed instructions to create a Star of David as we have been learning about Judaism in RE. They also wrote their own instructions on how to brush their teeth. In SPAG, we added the suffix 'er' to make a comparative adjective and understood when the spelling of the base word changed.

Topic

In Topic, the children found out about Tim Berners-Lee and how the world wide web changed the world. Children were able to use the internet safely and navigate around different websites to find information. We even sent an email to Mrs Cowell-Clark and she replied to us very quickly. We received her email before she could walk to our classroom!

Next week will be filled with consolidation as well as preparing for a new year group. There are lots of activities to look forward to including film afternoon, C Fest and much, much more.





Year 3 Bubble Group (Zagreb)

This week Zagreb class have learnt all about muscles inside their bodies. They learnt that they help us to move and are attached to our bones via tendons. They enjoyed going outside to practise using different muscle groups and making predictions about which ones they were using.

The children have also enjoyed completing their drafts of their light poems in English and have begun using their typing skills to write them up. In Maths, we have been exploring mass using grams and kilograms.







Next week in English, the children will be finishing typing up their light poems ready to be printed and displayed. In Maths, they will be recapping taught methods of the four operations.

The children are also so excited for 'C Fest' on Tuesday afternoon (our Clarborough end of year outdoor Festival) and they will be participating in lots of fun activities throughout the week to prepare them for their Summer holiday.

Year 5 Bubble Group (Caracas)



This week has been another busy one in Caracas starting off with a rather deflated class on Monday! We have been off timetable for much of the week, designing and making our 3D models of a river system. Pupils have been working in groups of three to design, make, paint and label their models. Despite being very messy, they have worked really well together and the models are a great example of what they have learned this half-term.









We have also been making the most of the lovely weather and spending time outdoors playing rounders, which is beginning to get very competitive but lots of fun!

Next week, we will be off timetable again as we round off the year with lots of fun and games, including another rounders tournament, our C-Fest, film treat and lots of other activities. The pupils have all worked extremely hard throughout this difficult year and I am so proud of them all!

Year 6 Bubble Group (Havana)

This week we have continued to work on using imaginative and colourful descriptions to create our poems based on 'The Magic Box'.

The children created some beautiful descriptive sentences describing the things that they would like to put into their boxes including wonderful things such as: stolen secrets never to be told, the first breath of a new-born baby, the last ray of sunshine on a winter's night, a submarine that flies through space and a rocket that explores the depths of the ocean.

Through Maths this week we have been analysing and studying statistics and understanding how we can graph the data that we have been given to answer analysis questions. We also looked, for the first time, at pie charts and how to construct them. We ended the week by looking at ratio and proportion and how we can use this to make comparisons between things. As well as this, we designed and created our own board games based on any area of mathematics that the children wanted. They had to design games that could only be played through the completion of some sort of mathematical calculation.

As a class, we also looked at and discussed the effects of harmful substances on the human body and created leaflets that advised people on how they could avoid these substances and the risks involved if they didn't.

Using their coding skills this week the children were given the opportunity to create their own versions of mini games using 'An Hour of Code'. This allows them, in a more simplified setting, to make their own versions of more popular games.

Next week is going to be very different from our previous weeks although there will still be a lot of work to be done!

We will be looking at the creation of a lunar theme park and how it can be possible to run, cost and maintain a park on the moon.

We will be producing some creative writing based upon a natural disaster that may or may not be happening at the school next week....(wink).

As well as this there will be a whole host of other activities that the children will be participating in, but for now.... I am going to say nothing... I will just say that I think we will have a lot of fun. Don't forget to join us for the premier of MMM Wednesday 21st July at 1.30pm.
