Reception: Mary Anning Class



This week we have been reading the story of 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' and have compared it to 'The Troll' by Julia Donaldson. The children made some very funny troll faces and 3D pictures of the story. We have also been recognising 2D shapes and making pictures on the interactive whiteboard by selecting the background we wanted and adding different objects or characters, resizing them if we needed to. The children have finished learning animal names in French, and Mrs Turton is really proud of how much they have remembered!

After the half term break we will be reading 'The Runaway Pancake' and learning about Pancake Day.



Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class



In Maths this week, Year 1 have been carrying out subtraction within 10 and in English, they have been completing their Phonics tracker. The children thoroughly enjoyed dressing up as a King or Queen on Thursday as part of their Clarborough Curriculum work. They enjoyed making their own crowns and finished writing up their 'Show me what you know' pieces of work. In French, the children have been learning the numbers 1-10 and in Science, they have been observing their sunflowers. In PE, Year 1 have been

practising their attacking and defending skills in football!

Homework over the Half Term – Please can you ensure that your child looks at their Phonics work over the Half Term.



Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class

This week in Maths, Year 2 have been dividing by 5 and 10 using bar models and making patterns with 3D shapes. They have also been using lines of symmetry to make wholes. In English, the children have been planning and writing their own adventure story using adjectives, adverbs and story language. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have been finishing their 'Show me what you know' on Christopher Columbus. The children have enjoyed making bookmarks in Art and carrying on with

their cross-stitch projects. In Computing, Year 2 have been making their own sprite and in French, they are able to say 'I can...' sentences.


Have a lovely half term Year 2 – see you all back on Monday 20th February!

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class



In Maths this week, Year 3 have been looking at units of fractions and counting in fractions. They have also been looking at bar charts. In English, the children have planned the final paragraphs of their 'new species' report and written these as part of their Big Write. They are so proud of these! In VIPERS, Year 3 have been looking at climate change and Safer Internet Day. The children have finished their 'Show me what you know' in Clarborough Curriculum. In Art, Year 3 have been drawing tree frogs and using patterns to decorate a chameleon.

After Half Term, Year 3 will be looking the Mayans. Have a great Half Term everyone!






In Maths this week, Year 4 have been looking at time. They have been telling the time to the minute, converting between 12 and 24 hours and completing time reasoning problems. In English, the children have been preparing to write their newspaper articles about a champion gladiator losing a fight to an unknown fighter. The children used headlines, paragraphs, quotes and, direct and reported speech. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 4 looked at the importance of roads in developing the Roman Empire and their road layouts. In Science, the children investigated sound-proofing and looked at how to dampen the

vibrations that make sound. In PHSE, they continued with their one world topic and looked at how charities support children around the world and in RE, they looked at Buddhist places of worship. The children have looked at being safe on the internet and age restrictions on Apps in Computing and in French, they have been discussing their family.

Over Half Term, please can you continue with your Roman project! Enjoy your half term everyone!


Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class



In Maths this week, Year 5 have been calculating volume and using the Unifix cubes to help them when finding the volume of shapes. In English, they have used a text about climbing Mount Everest to help them write their own narratives. In Geography, the children discussed the positives and negatives of tourism within mountain environments and in PHSE, they looked at the idea of community and different ways that we could help in our own community. In French, Year 5 have been describing the animals that they have together with their names.

Homework over Half Term: Please could you practise your spellings over the Half Term. Have a lovely Half Term!

Year 6: Alan Turing Class



This week, Year 6 have completed their assessments in Reading, SPaG and Maths (not under test conditions) so that we can tailor their learning for after half term. The children received their papers back and identified where they made positives and negatives. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children completed their persuasive leaflets to promote people to visit Stig's den. Year 6 homework: SPaG, reading comprehension and Maths pages 36, 37, 38 and 39. After Half Term, spellings will be moved to Wednesday afternoons.

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CALL 01777 700252 www.lynxmartialarts.com Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.

If vehicles are in parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice.

These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles. The school can request enforcement from the car if there any concerns regarding parking.
