Road Safety and Supervision of children



There have been two incidents where children have been put in danger by drivers on Hillview Crescent. For this reason, we have decided to cone off part of the school drive to make drop-offs and pick-ups as safe as possible. Please be extra vigilant particularly as the mornings and afternoons are now darker. We are aware this moves parking further into the Crescent so you must ensure that where you park does not block the driveways of our residents also.

Please ensure parental supervision and control over children when attending and leaving school – holding hands and not allowing children to walk/run across the roads unsupervised. Thank you.

Join the Winter Mini Challenge



The Winter Mini Challenge is aimed at children aged 4-11 years and encourages children to keep reading over the winter period.

The Winter Mini Challenge is run through the Winter Mini Challenge website. To take part, children simply read three books of their choice over the winter holidays, then add each book to their Winter Reading Challenge website profile and leave a short book review. Books added to the website during the six week Mini Challenge period will count towards unlocking special rewards including a certificate and a virtual badge.

How to take part:

- Sign up at www.winterreadingchallenge.org.uk to create an online profile (if you took part in Silly Squad: The Summer Reading Challenge you might have a profile already)
- Read at least 3 books over the holidays.
- Rate and review the books on the Winter Mini Challenge website to unlock a virtual badge and download a certificate to print.

The Winter Mini Challenge finishes on Friday 15 January.



Guidance regarding COVID and positive testing over the Christmas Holidays

• If a pupil or staff member tests positive for Coronavirus, having <u>developed</u> symptoms within 48hours of being in school, then please <u>contact the office</u> at <u>office@clarborough.notts.sch.uk</u> and we will assist in identifying close contacts

and advising self-isolation in line with guidance from Public Health England and the DfE, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in school

So, if you or child develops symptoms on Friday 18th December, Saturday 19th December or Sunday 20th December and you receive a positive result for COVID-19, please contact the office and we will identify close contacts and then advise self-isolation. This is because you would be within the 48hours infectious period.

 Where pupils are required to self-isolate due to contact with a positive case after 6 days from the last day of term, schools do not need to be contacted about their absence until the first day of the new term.

So, if you have been in contact with a positive case after 24th December and are self-isolating, you do not need to contact school until we return on Tuesday 5th January 2021.

• If a pupil or staff member tests positive for Coronavirus, having <u>developed symptoms more than</u> 48hours since being in school, the school does not need to be contacted.

So, if you or your child develops symptoms <u>after Sunday 20th December and you have a test carried out and it is confirmed positive, you do not need to inform school. This is because this is beyond the 48hours infectious period. Parents and carers would need to follow the contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace and isolating guidance.</u>

• Opening in January: if you or your child has symptoms of COVID and receives a positive test please contact the office at office@clarborough.notts.sch.uk on Sunday 3rd January. This way we can ensure the class bubbles can re-open safely for children and staff the new term after consulting Public Health England.

On Wednesday 16th December, the children will be having their traditional Christmas lunch with Christmas hats and crackers.



Year 2 Bubble Group (Wellington)









Year 3 Star of the week: Charlotte for her amazing extravaganza performance and ensuring no one forgot the words - Well done Charlotte!


Year 4 Bubble Group (Riga)

In Art this week, they have planned and created their amazing dragon's eye out of clay, taking care with different techniques and the detail added.










Maths:
