We have been counting to 70 in ones and tens and have realised that the Queen would have been Queen when our parents were little and even when Mrs Turton was little!!

We have had lots of discussions about why the photos and TV clips of the Coronation are in black and white, rather than colour, and have looked for similarities and differences between what things looked like in 1953, compared with what they look like now.

The children have drawn and painted fantastic portraits of the Queen, and have made flags and crowns for our street party.







After the half-term break we will be learning about London landmarks, and will be practising making ten in different ways.



Stars of the week: Everyone for blowing Mrs Turton's socks off with their amazing writing!


Year 1 (Joan Miro)

After half term, the children will be learning about their new topic, focusing on the life of Neil Armstrong.




Star of the week: Ollie for wanting to write lots of sentences for your 'view from the balcony' writing!




Year 2 (L.S. Lowry)

Next term, the children will be exploring their new topic ... watch this space to find out more!




Star of the week: Ernie for improving his writing and using finger spaces!

Year 3 (William Morris)



The children have continued with their work on weight and capacity this week in Maths. In English, they have completed a big write on the Victorians and produced a newspaper article.

Next term, the children will be using persuasive language for use in leaflets in English. In Maths, they will be continuing with fraction work and in Geography we will be looking at maps.

Year 4 (Salvador Dali)

In Maths this week, the children have been trying to unlock a box containing 'the Queen's tiara' — when they solved the maths problems, they received the combination to the box. Inside were sweets!

They have also created a fact file about the Queen in English and baked some Victoria Sponge cakes for the Queen's Jubilee celebrations!





After half term, Year 4 will be sticking with the explorer theme and in Maths they will be looking at shape, position and direction together with completing their Multiplication Check. Please have a look at the resources and links on the school website for further practise and information on this check.

In English, our focus will be on 'biography' and we will be reading 'The Race to the Frozen North' by Catherine Johnson and 'Shackleton's Journey' by William Grill. In Science, the children will be looking at light and in Clarborough Curriculum we will be looking at maps and countries and the children will create their own maps with a key and an 8-point compass.



Star of the week: All of Year 4 for working so incredibly hard this week!




Year 5 (Banksy)

In English this week, Year 5 have been writing their 'life of a balcony' story inspired by Buckingham Palace. In Maths the children have been multiplying decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000 and in Art, they are creating images of the Queen using graffiti art.

Next term, Year 5 will be writing a recount for their river stories. They will be looking at the properties of shape in Maths and in Science they will be learning about properties and changes in materials.


A big well done to Stanley who has been very busy this week! He has completed his Stage 5 in swimming and received his 50m swimming certificate.

Well done Bertie on your certificate and medal from gymnastics this week – keep up the good work!








Huge congratulations to Katie who achieved her 5m Rainbow Distance Certificate in swimming this week - Well done Katie, great effort!
