
Accelerated Reader Millionaires



Workshops available at Idle Valley during August

This first workshop will give you the opportunity to learn how to conduct a water survey on-site. One of our rangers will walk the children through how to test the PH of the water at Bellmor Lake. Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.
