Please note that fidget toys or any other sort of toy <u>should not</u> be brought into school unless you have spoken with your teacher and they have permitted your child to bring it in.


Nursery and 30hrs (Frida Kahlo)



How lovely to be back with our children, full of jubilee excitement and tales of flags, parties and memories made!

This week we have been thinking about one of the most important vehicles on the road.....the ambulance.

Our role play area is now a hospital and the children have learnt how to use a stethoscope and enjoyed treating various patients. We made headbands and ambulances, creating repeating patterns at the same time.







Reception (Georgia O'Keeffe)



This week we have been learning about London. We have talked about the differences between villages, towns and cities and have looked on a map to see where London is.

We have learnt that a capital city is the most important city in a country and have recognised lots of London landmarks - some of them we saw during the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations!

Year 1 (Joan Miro)




In Year 1 this week, the children have been reading the story 'The Man on the Moon.' They have been asking Bob (the astronaut) questions using question marks.


Next week, Year 1 will be writing stories about travelling to the moon and in Maths they will be making arrays and doubling.

Star of the week: Katie for working so well independently and speeding up her writing!


Year 2 (L.S. Lowry)

In Art, they have created space pictures using different media and in Maths, the children have been learning about fractions.

Next week, Year 3 will be finding out more about angles and turns. They

will be understanding tenths as decimals. They will continue to use persuasive language in English and look at Kings Park and ways to advertise the park so people come and visit. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children will be completing their 'Show me what you know about Victorians.'

Star of the week: Maia for having a fantastic attitude towards her learning. She is always so engaged and works so hard!






Year 4 (Salvador Dali)

In Maths, Year 4 have been learning about angles. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have been starting their new focus on North America and in English, they are writing biographies based on the book 'Race to the Frozen North.'

In Science, the children looked at the physical properties of solid, liquid

and gas materials. The children also spent some time this week creating digital art around school – they produced some amazing pictures!
