Please also note that **Breakfast club starts from 7.45am and children will not be allowed into school before this time. Thank you.**


Star of the Week




Well done everyone!


Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class



In Maths, the children have been weighing in grams and in English, Year 1 have been making predictions about what the story 'The Queen's Hat' may be about and retrieving information from the text.

In Science, the children have also been looking at plants and labelling parts of a plant. Their Computing work has been focused on using Music Case. They have been learning le couleurs in French.




Next week, they will be looking at 2-D and 3-D shapes, they will be writing about Polar animals and they will be 'exploring the cold.'



Year 3: Mary Jackson Class



In Maths this week, the children in Year 3 have been counting and converting money in pounds and pence. They have also been adding money together. In English, they have been making notes and researching issues about rainforests in preparation for a report. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 have been learning about rainforests and locating them across the globe. They have also been focusing on nutrition and sorting foods into different food groups. In Computing, the children have been looking at music creation and creating ascending and descending scales and in French, they have been

recapping last term's learning on greetings.







Next week, Year 3 will be writing a letter to Chili the Polar Bear, they will be drawing polar bears and they will be 'exploring the cold.'

Year 4: Richard Leakey Class



In Maths, the children in Year 4 have been finding fractions of amounts and looking at equivalent fractions. In English, they have been planning instructions on how to be a Roman soldier and in Clarbrough Curriculum they have been focusing on being part of one world and comparing lives to people in Africa. The children have been looking at early settlers and also at how Rome was founded. In Science, Year 4 have been looking at the structure of ears to find out about how we hear sounds and they have been producing line drawings in Art. They have also been programming with Scratch in Computing and working

on La Famille in French.




Next week, Year 4 will be 'exploring the cold' looking at climate change, people native to polar areas and survival in cold weather.

Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class




In Maths, the children in Year 5 have been converting units of measurement and creating a fact file about Mount Everest in English. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have been understanding what a mountain is and locating major mountain regions using atlases. They have also enjoyed making three types of burger patties to try, used Sampulator and Beat Box to create sounds in Computing and have been naming pets in French.





Next week, the children in Year 5 will be multiplying and dividing in Maths, they will be reading a recount of a trek across the Khumbu Ice Fall in English, creating burger sauces and 'exploring the cold.'

Year 6: Alan Turing Class



This week, the Year 6 children have been dividing fractions by integers as well as multiplying fractions. In English, they have been writing character descriptions about Stig from 'Stig of the Dump' and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children have started their topic work on the Stone Age. They have been looking at living organisms and microorganisms in Science and they have been creating their own café menus in French! They have also been focusing on alcohol and drug misuse in DAaRT with Officer Lyndsey Ball.

Congratulations to Miran who received his 10m Rainbow Distance swimming certificate – Amazing work Miran!




Well done to Maggie who received her 5m Rainbow Distance swimming certificate – Brilliant work Maggie!

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Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.

If vehicles are parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice.

These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles.

The school can request enforcement from the car if there are any concerns regarding parking.

Do not park on school keep clear markings

Our CCTV car is now out patrolling Nottinghamshire schools to help discourage dangerous and inconsiderate parking.

Motorists caught parking on restricted areas near schools or in bus stops will be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) of £70.

Parking on school keep clear markings can seriously endanger road safety for children. Please only park in marked areas and help us keep our school children safe.
