We have had a busy week of learning and fun! The children have been busy creating some lovely work for their Xmas4Schools designs. You should have received them this week. ## Nursery and 30hrs: Ole Kirk Christianson



We love Autumn! We are encouraging the children to notice the changes in the trees and it has been wonderful to see them becoming more aware of the passing of time through this simple activity. In preparation for our harvest activities, we have also been talking about scarecrows and the children have produced these beautiful collages. It's always a fine line with young children between teaching them the skills they need for crafts, like snipping and sticking, whilst allowing them to express themselves. We love the expressions on the scarecrow faces! We have also played a variety of listening games as part of our topic Marvellous Me, but our ears are so fabulous I think we will continue with it next week too!



This week we have been thinking about our sense of touch and have been describing different textures, e.g. smooth, bumpy, soft, hard and rough. We have continued to look for signs of autumn and have made autumn wands with some of the things that we have collected. The children have been making repeating patterns using 2,3 or even more colours, and have used other characteristics such as size to make patterns. Next week, we will be thinking about the senses of smell and taste and will be learning about different types of measurements.


Year 1: Tim Berners-Lee


This week in Maths, Year 1 have been working on one to one correspondence counting and in English the children have been creating a descriptive sentence and using the word 'and' to join two ideas together. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 1 have been finding out about King James I of England and in Art, the children have been cutting out a stencil to print with. In Computing, the children have used a lap top for the very first time! We practised using the keypad and trackpad - very exciting!

Next week, in Maths, Year 1 will be comparing objects and in English, the children will continue to write descriptive sentences.


This week in Maths, Year 2 have been estimating numbers on a number line and thinking about what they know of numbers already. They have also been comparing objects and saying which group has more or less together with making different amounts of money.

In English, the children have been writing a diary entry on the aftermath of 'The Great Fire of London'. They have been thinking about their senses and what they could see, smell, hear, etc.

In Clarborough Curriculum this week, the children have been looking at features of hot and cold places, thinking about what the weather might be like and in Art, the class have been creating a background using collage as a media, for our picture of 'The Great Fire'.

Next week, Year 2 will be creating a healthy plate, including all the food groups and in French they will be replying to the question 'How are you?'

Year 3: Thomas Edison


This week in Maths, Year 3 have been working on addition and subtraction and used their knowledge of number bonds to add a 2digit and a 1-digit number.

In English, the children have been identifying conjunctions and using these to join sentences. The children have also been planning their own story based on 'The Stone Age Boy'.

In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 have looked at art in the 'Iron Age' and thought about what it would have been like inside a hillfort.

In Science, the children have been understanding that magnetic forces can act at a distance. They conducted an investigation to measure a magnetic field by measuring and observing the distance a paperclip was attracted to a magnet.

Next week in Year 3, the children will add and subtract 2-digit numbers and, add and subtract multiples of 100. In English, the children will be writing their own stories and starting to look at performance poetry. They will also continue to look at the Iron Age as part of their Clarborough Curriculum topic and in Science, the children will look at what a compass is and understand how it works.

Year 4: Jane Goodall


In Maths, Year 4 have been learning how to round numbers up to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. In English, the children have begun their new text, Cowboys, and have been understanding the meaning of new vocabulary and writing simple descriptions using expanded noun phrases.

Within Clarborough Curriculum this week, Year 4 learned about Mount St Helens; finding out information about its geographical location, significant eruptions and the devastation caused. In DT, the children designed and made suspension bridges!

In Computing, as part of our E-Safety unit, Year 4 created their own avatars and in French the children learned four new phonemes.

Next Week, in Maths, the children will look at addition of four-digit numbers, in English, they will be planning and writing a journey narrative and in Clarborough Curriculum, they will be creating a double page spread about North America. In DT, the children will be looking at how suspension bridges are able to span long distances and in Science, they will be learning about food chains.

## Year 5: Jacques Cousteau



This week in Year 5, the children have started an addition and subtraction unit as part of their Maths topic and in English, they have been reading the biography of Katherine Johnson and learning about what a biography is.

Within Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been learning about Gods and Goddesses through History and in Art, the children have been painting their Greek vases.

Next week, in Maths, Year 5 will be continuing working on addition and subtraction problems and in English they will continue to look at biographies and their structures.

Year 6: Albert Einstein


This week, Year 6 have been looking at factors, prime numbers, multiples and rules of divisibility. In English, they have been using emotive and figurative language to plan and draft a poem based on WW2.

In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been looking at and understanding what happened at The Battle of Dunkirk. In Science, they have conducted an investigation in which to find conditions for mould to grow and in French, they have been looking at timetables. In Computing, the class have been looking at computers in the past, present and future.

Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.

If vehicles are in parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice.
