Please also note that Breakfast club starts from 7.45am and children will not be allowed into school before this time. Thank you.


Star of the Week

Nursery and 30hrs: Percy Shaw Class



We have had a wonderful week learning about different feelings and emotions. This can be tricky for young children to understand as they tend to only think of themselves and have to be taught the skill of interpreting how others are feeling. Reception: Mary Anning Class



This week, we have continued to learn about our feelings and have talked about jealousy - what it is, how it makes us feel, and why we might feel it. We have also continued to look at similarities and differences between the past and the present, and have begun learning about old toys. The children have had lots of fun playing marbles and tiddlywinks, and have made their own spinners and puppets.

We used the mobile library for the first time on Thursday, and the children enjoyed choosing a book to borrow, as well as some books for the classroom.

Next week, we will be continuing to learn about old toys, and will also be learning about the Coronation of King Charles III.







Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class



This week, Year 1 have been representing numbers up to 50 and then looking at one more and one less. In English, they have been re-telling the story of 'The Man on the Moon' and in Clarborough Curriculum, they have been finding out who Neil Armstrong was and why he is famous. This involved the children asking and answering questions to find out the facts. In Computing, the children created some mosaic animals and in Art, they looked at Monet's cityscape prints and then created their own using pastels.

Next week, Year 1 will be comparing objects within 50 and in English, they will be describing a setting.






Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class

This week, Year 2 have been completing multiplication and division word problems in Maths and in English, they have been writing character descriptions using adjectives and conjunctions together with time openers and adverbs. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been looking at the differences and similarities of the seaside from the past to the present and in Music, they have been learning and singing 'The Friendship Song'. In French, Year 2 have been learning to say the names of vegetables and in Science, they have been carrying out investigations to find out what plants need to grow and stay

healthy.



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Next week, Year 2 will be completing their SATs revision. Papers and resources have been put on Seesaw to help you with this.

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class




This week, in Maths, Year 3 have been comparing mass, adding and subtracting mass and measuring capacity by carrying out an investigation using millilitres and litres. In English, they have been writing up their character description using expanded noun phrases. The children have also been using their Rainbow Grammar strips to write sentences about a picture. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 have been understanding what it was like at school during the Victorian times looking at items such as the dunce cap, cane and the difference between rich and poor backgrounds.

Just a reminder that our Victorian Day is on Wednesday 17th May – we are so excited! In Art, the children have been looking at William Morris and understanding the arts and crafts movement and in PE, Year 3 have been learning how to bowl in cricket. In Science, they have been looking at reflective surfaces and designing a new book bag incorporating this.

Next week, Year 3 will be comparing volume and, adding and subtracting capacity in Maths. In English, the children will be using noun phrases and personification in a variety of ways to open a story and in Clarborough Curriculum, they will be looking at a Workhouse and learning why people ended up there.







Year 4: Richard Leakey Class




In Maths this week, Year 4 have been looking at multiplication and division. The children started the week with short multiplication, calculating 3-digit x 1-digit numbers, and then moved on to short division. They ended the week with multiplication and division word problems. In English, the children continued with their suspense stories. They read an example text and then analysed it for suspense features. Year 4 then worked on using similes, metaphors and personification together with some creative writing using Rainbow Grammar. In Clarborough Curriculum, they continued looking at the voyage of The

Mayflower using the book 'The boy who fell off The Mayflower'. The children discussed the journey and its trials and looked at how and why illnesses gripped those on board the ship. During PSHE, Year 4 continued with the topic 'money matters' and researched different methods of payments and discussed their advantages and disadvantages. In Science, the children investigated gases by carrying out an experiment measuring how much gas was found in fizzy drinks by weighing them closed and fizzy vs open and flat, and in Computing, they continued using PowerPoint to create stop motion animations. In Art, the children have been creating their own Native American dreamcatchers.

Next week, Year 4 will be planning and writing their stories in English and looking at fractions, decimals and percentages in Maths. In PSHE, the children will discuss borrowing and lending money and in Science, they will be investigating heating and cooling.



Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class




In Maths, Year 5 have been adding and subtracting decimals with the same number of decimal places, using either place value charts and counters or column addition or subtraction. In English, they have been continuing on from last week and continuing to explore the opening of 'The Egyptian Cinderella'; understanding adverbs of manner, planning and drafting their own openings.

In Clarborough Curriculum, as part of our ancient Egyptian topic, the children have learned about the importance of the River Nile to the ancient Egyptian people for transport, farming, bathing and other reasons.


In Science, Year 5 have explored the effect gravity has on objects and how gravity was discovered. In Art, they added watercolours to their portrait poems from last week, choosing colours appropriately to reflect a mood or feeling. In Computing, Scratch was used to write a program with inputs, movements, selection, sensing and data variables and in French, pupils learned how to ask what the weather is like and answer using their French vocabulary.

Next week, Year 5 will be adding and subtracting decimals with a different number of decimal places, planning the middle of their Egyptian story, investigating air resistance in Science and learning about the process of mummification, including an exciting experiment with tomatoes!





Year 6: Alan Turing Class



This week, in Maths, Year 6 have been calculating different measures, looking at fractions, decimals, percentages, ratio and proportion. In English, they have been looking at possessive and relative pronouns together with verb tenses and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been learning the names of the different Anglo-Saxon Kings. In PSHE, the children have been looking at the changes in our own bodies due to puberty and exploring roles and responsibilities as changes occur. In RE, Year 6 have been understanding 'Motivation' and standing up for what's right and in French, they have been able to ask for the time.

Next week, Year 6 will be looking at the properties of shape, position and direction in Maths, subjective form and synonyms in English and in Science, they will be understanding healthy, positive relationships. In RE, they will be looking at Muslim beliefs and throughout the week, also celebrating the King's Coronation!
