#### **Reception: Mary Anning Class**



This week, the Reception children have been talking about special days; why we have them, what makes them special and how we celebrate them. The children have listened to the story of Rama and Sita and found out about the way that people decorate their homes for Diwali with diva lamps and Rangoli patterns.

#### Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class

This week in Year 1, in Maths the children have been completing assessments and in English they have written and performed 'The 3 Little Pigs' for the class. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have completed their 'Show me what you know' projects.

Your child will be coming home with Phonics workbooks and when they hand them in after the half term, the children will receive a treat!



## Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class



This week in Maths the children have been counting in 3s and practising their 2s, 5s and 10s. In English, the children wrote a letter to the wolf from 'The 3 Little Pigs' and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children learned about what happened to Mary Seacole after the war. In French, they have been learning about different shapes.

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Year 2's homework over the half term will be practising place value with numbers to 100 together with practising phonic sounds.

#### Year 3: Mary Jackson Class



In Maths, Year 3 have been learning about placing their digits in the correct place and adding and subtracting multiples of 10 and 100. In English, they have published stories about Perseus, the Greek god and they have been looking at different spelling rules. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have finished their Greek vases by adding their details and completing their 'Show me what you know' on Greeks. In Art, they have completed their Christmas pictures and designed some Halloween characters.








Over the half term, there are links on Seesaw for activities to be completed at home.

#### Year 4: Richard Leakey Class





In Science, the children completed their branching databases.

In Maths, the children have been enjoying inverse operations and in English they have been looking at the differences experienced by rich and poor children in the Tudor times. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have completed their 'Show me what you know' on their Tudor work and in Art, Year 5 have completed their Antony Gormley inspired sculptures.



# Year 6: Alan Turing Class



In Maths, the children staying in school did a Maths challenge which involved designing a zoo using area, perimeter and multiplication. In English, the children have been finishing a newspaper article based on the book 'The Island' and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children completed some WW2 propaganda. In PE, the children were able to perform some amazing gymnastics balancing positions!

# Part-Time Early Years 1:1 Teaching Assistant

The role will include: providing support to teachers with the learning and personal development of pupils with complex needs and/or disabilities to whom you are assigned and to enable the best use of the educational opportunities available to them.

We are looking for an outstanding person who can use their initiative, is committed, hardworking and eager to develop personally and who will inspire, challenge and support children, staff and parents. The successful candidate will need to aid the pupil to learn as effectively as possible both in group situations and on their own. For example: by clarifying and explaining instructions, ensuring the pupil is able to use equipment and materials provided, motivating and encouraging the pupil as required by providing levels of individual attention, reassurance and help with learning tasks as appropriate to pupils' needs and promoting the acceptance and inclusion of the pupil with SEND, encouraging pupils to interact with each other in an appropriate and acceptable manner.

Experience is good but we are willing to train!

This NJE Grade 2, Point 2 post is initially for one year and starts as soon as possible. Working hours are Monday to Friday mornings. We strongly recommend that you come and visit our school before applying so you can see Team Clarborough at work – a whole morning session would be ideal.

#### **Local News**



Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.
