
On Wednesday 16th December, the children will be having their traditional Christmas lunch with Christmas hats and crackers. **You can book in and pay for this now on Parentmail.**

We have also had a visit from an elf called Little Rascal who leaves a treat for the children each morning... if they can find her!







Nursery Star of the week: David for always trying his best!

Even more exciting news – James lost his first tooth!






Year 2 Star of the week: Mazey B for reading at home and persevering when things are difficult!




The children really enjoyed making a tsunami with waves and creating a tornado in a jar!




In Maths, the children enjoyed creating their own 3 times table games by working together with their buddy. They then visited each table to explore what had been created! Great fun!








In Maths, they have been learning about square numbers and enjoyed using the Numicon to show square numbers up to 144.
