# Reception (Georgia O'Keeffe)




This week we have been looking at old vehicles, comparing them to new ones, looking at how they have changed and finding out how they work.


#### Year 1 (Joan Miro)

Next week, they are practising their division and looking forward to the rescheduled Sports Day!






# Year 2 (L.S. Lowry)

# Year 5 (Banksy)



Next week, the children will be finding out more about coordinates in Maths and they will be completing their instructions about mummification and finding out more about the Ancient Egyptians.












# Year 6 (Lucian Freud)
