

responsibilities at school and at home and in PE, they have been doing upper body exercises and balancing on the apparatus. Merry Christmas everyone and have a happy New Year!


## Year 4: Richard Leakey Class


playing indoor games (to keep out of the cold!). Have a lovely Christmas and a happy New Year!

Well done to Rion who received her Stage 5 Splash certificate last week – Fantastic work Rion!


A big well done to Alfie who received his 5m Splash certificate last week – Amazing work Alfie!

Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.

If vehicles are in parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice.

These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles.

The school can request enforcement from the car if there any concerns regarding parking.
