Nursery and 30hrs Bubble Group (Dakar)






Year 2 Bubble Group (Wellington)


Year 4 Bubble Group (Riga)



Year 5 Bubble Group (Caracas)



This week in Caracas Class, children have continued their learning about coordinates in Maths and have enjoyed spelling their name using points on a coordinate grid and solved reasoning problems requiring them to explain their knowledge or thinking.



In English, they have focused on their reading comprehension and GPS skills through reading a variety of texts with a space theme, combining Science and English. They were amazed to learn that the International Space Station is the size of a football pitch, has its own gym and orbits the Earth 16 times in one day! They have also been using clips from David Attenborough's BBC One - Life series to apply their understanding of coordinating conjunctions in GPS.

In Computing, they have completed their own eBooks, which are multiple choice quizzes based on COVID-Safety at Clarborough. They have learned to combine text, images and hyperlinks to create their books.



The final virtual session with Doncaster Rovers was an active Maths lesson, in which they generated and created their own data before using this data to create bar charts.

Year 6 Bubble Group (Havana)






This week the children have been busy writing their discussion texts where they debated whether Stone Age man should hunt mammoths.

Asymptomatic testing information for parents and adults in households with children at school or college

NHS Test and Trace announced earlier this week that all adults in households with school and college age children without symptoms can now access regular rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing.

Test kits can either be collected or ordered online, as set out below. Schools should not give test kits to parents, carers or household members and should not order more test kits for this purpose. Secondary school and college students will continue to access testing through their school or college.

Please share the information below with your parent networks to help answer any questions they may have. Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are [different ways](#) for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site – anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests
- by ordering a home test kit online – please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most
