Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class

This week in Maths, the children have been counting forwards and backwards and in English, they have been writing speech from the characters in the story of 'The Three Little Pigs'.



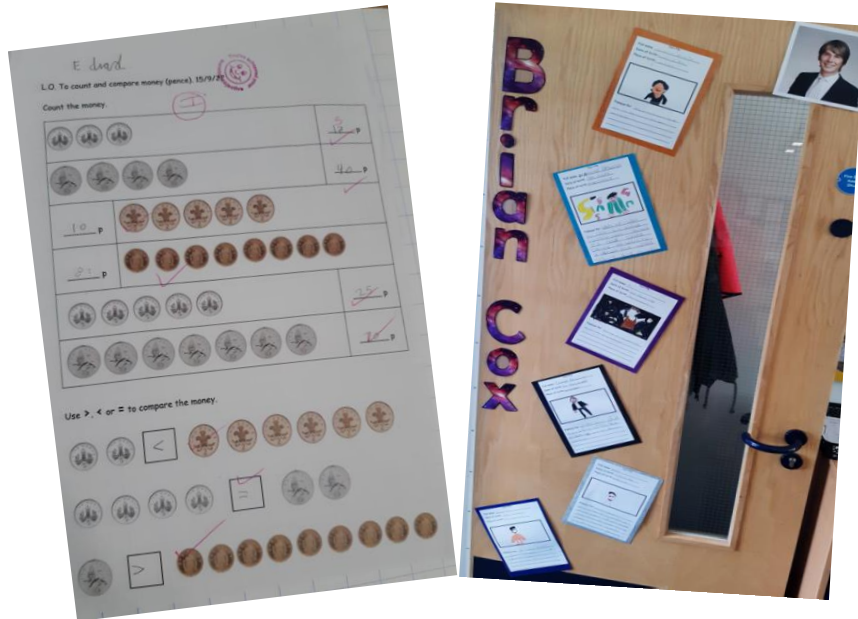
In Science, Year 1 have been looking at the different types of materials and in Computing, they have been learning to log on to a computer.

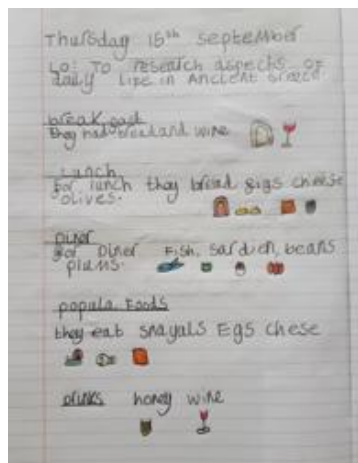

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class

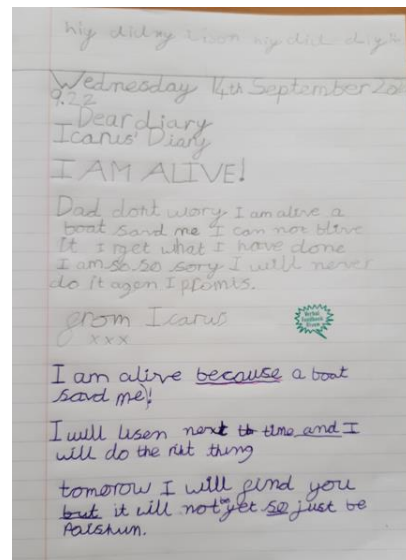
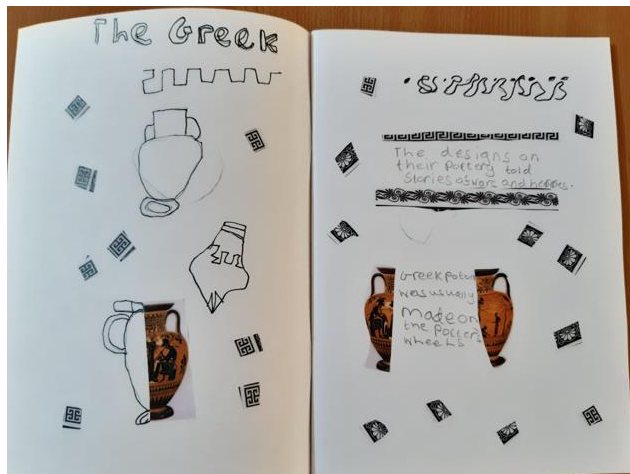


This week in Maths, the children in Year 3 have been reading and writing numbers to 1000 and finding one more and one less.

They are learning their spellings as part of their homework and in English they are using conjunctions in their stories about Icarus and investigating -ology.



In Clarbrough Curriculum, Year 3 are finding out about foods eaten in Ancient Greek times and in French they are learning to say 'my name is ...'



Their art work is looking at Ancient Greek pottery.

Next week, they are comparing numbers and ordering numbers. They will be answering questions as characters from Greek myths and using speech marks too.

Year 4: Richard Leakey Class



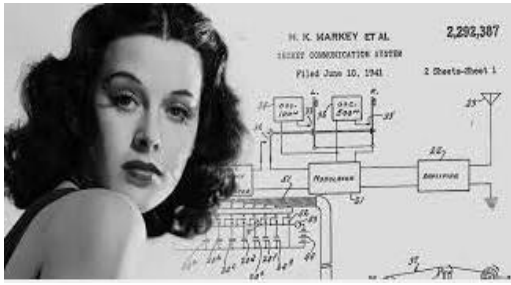

Year 4 have also produced some amazing work for display in the Under the Sea area – Great work Year 4!

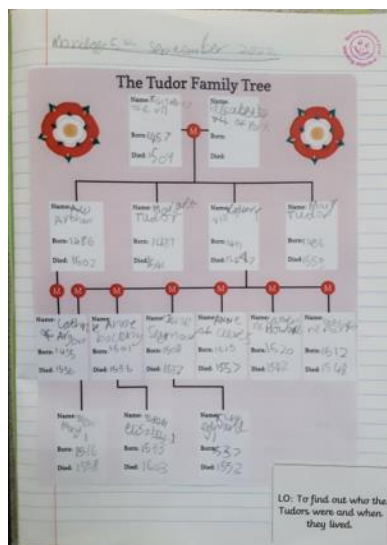

Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class



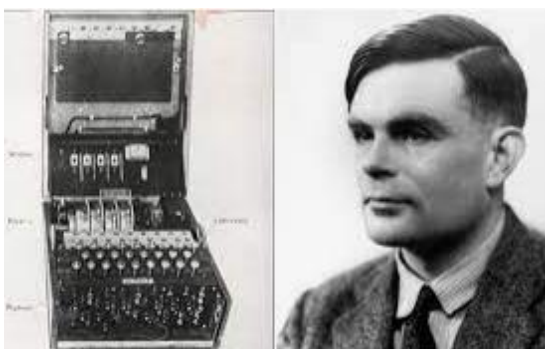
This week in Maths, the children have been partitioning numbers to one million. In English they have been looking at the life of Queen Elizabeth II and in Computing, they have been coding using Code Monkey to write number variables.

They have also been finding out about Tudor fashion, comparing the styles from the rich and poor. In Art, they have been learning about the work of Antony Gormley.



Next week, in Maths they will be rounding to one million and they will be writing biographies of the Queen in English. In History, they will be investigating food from the Tudor time

Local News

Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.

If vehicles are parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice.

These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles.

The school can request enforcement from the car if there are any concerns regarding parking.

Do not park on school keep clear markings

Our CCTV car is now out patrolling Nottinghamshire schools to help discourage dangerous and inconsiderate parking.

Motorists caught parking on restricted areas near schools or in bus stops will be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) of £70.

Parking on school keep clear markings can seriously endanger road safety for children. Please only park in marked areas and help us keep our school children safe.
