Nursery and 30hrs: Percy Shaw Class




This week we have been learning all about the number 2. This does not involve looking at the numeral at this stage (what a written 2 looks like) but seeing patterns of two all around us... our eyes, windows in a window frame, 2 random bricks fallen on the floor. This deep understanding is crucial for children's mathematical understanding. Linked to this we have looked at the book 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear, what do you see?'. The children have made their own copy of the book, painted characters from it and many are able to recite the whole thing from memory! I cannot tell you how important these pre-reading skills are. 
encourage your child to 'read' their book to you at home so you can be as proud of them as we are! Next week, we are moving onto our listening with our ears based on the story 'Polar Bear, Polar Bear, what do you HEAR?'.











Reception: Mary Anning Class




This week we have been learning about our five senses and how we use them. We have been on a sensory walk outside to see what we could see, hear, smell and feel...we found lots of things to see and lots of different textures to touch, but it was trickier to find lots of different noises and smells. We have also tried tasting sweets with our eyes closed to see if we could tell what flavour they were without seeing them...it was trickier than we thought it would be!

We have looked at the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood' and have talked about the characters and the story setting and towards the end of the week, the children have been looking for triangles and circles and thinking about their properties.








Next week, we will be thinking about the similarities and differences between countries and environments around the world, and we will continue our learning about 'Little Red Riding Hood'.

Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class


This week, in Maths, Year 1 have been comparing number bonds and adding two digits together. In English, the children have been sequencing the story of the Gunpowder Plot. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been learning about King James I and in Art, they have been designing the structure of the Houses of Parliament. In Computing, the



















Next week, Year 1 will be learning fact families of 1-10 in Maths and in English, they will be writing their own Bonfire poems. In Clarborough Curriculum, they will be researching Guy Fawkes and in Computing, they will be learning about E-safety again. In Geography, the children will be recording the features of Clarborough and Retford.



Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class

In Maths, Year 2 have been adding two numbers, completing fact families, learning about time and using tally charts. In English, the children have written a poem and recorded themselves reciting their poem. They also completed a word bank about their poem. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been producing facts about Winston Churchill and his lifestyle. In French, they have learnt colours and numbers and in Computing the children have learnt about E-safety. In PSHE, the children produced safety signs and in RE, the children learnt about Moses.






Next week, the children will be writing a letter in English and in Maths, they will be learning about pictograms.

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class




In Maths, the children have been comparing and converting lengths together with subtracting lengths. In English, the children completed a character profile for 'The Iron Man'. They also wrote sentences which included apostrophes for possession and a poem about Remembrance.





In Clarborough Curriculum, the children learnt how volcanoes are formed and in French, they learnt about animals and when to use 'un' and 'une'. In Art, the children used a continuous line to draw cubist features and then used this technique to draw a full face. In Computing, they designed a town for a purpose with a budget and they played 'Don't flood the fidget'.









Next week, in Maths the children will be looking at what a perimeter is and measuring and calculating perimeters. In English, they will be producing a setting description and in Clarborough Curriculum, they will be looking at how volcanoes affect lives. In Art, the children will be looking at the technique of cross hatching.

Year 4: Richard Leakey Class


In Maths, the children have been learning about perimeters and how to convert different lengths. In English, they have been writing information texts about Chinese dragons and writing paragraphs about their diet, habitats and behaviour. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 4 have been learning about countries North and South of the Equator and in PSHE, they have been learning about responsibilities and their own responsibilities.

In Science, the children have been learning about teeth and in Art, they have been producing some Remembrance art work. In Computing, the children have been creating eBooks. In French, they are understanding and learning how to say sentences about pets.












Next week, in Maths, the children will be continuing with converting different lengths, dividing by 10 and 100 and reasoning problems. In English, the children will be starting to write their story about the journey through the digestive system. In Clarborough Curriculum, they will be learning about Shang Dynasty artefacts and in Science, they will be looking at the digestive system. In Geography, they will be looking at the Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn.

Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class



In Maths, Year 5 have been learning about squared and cubed numbers and in English, they have started writing instructions on their map work. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been investigating how to create circuits with switches and in Science, they have been looking at the key stages of the life cycles of mammals. In Computing, the children have been making their own apps; including the welcome page, texts and pictures and in French, the children have been learning the names of family members.









Next week, in Maths, Year 5 will be looking at prime numbers and multiplying by 10, 100 and 1000. In English, they will continue writing up their instructions for their maps and publishing them on their laptops. In Science, they will be understanding what gestation is.

Year 6: Alan Turing Class



In Maths, the children have been carrying out short division using short division methods. In English, they have been learning how to use Rainbow Grammar including relative clauses, adverbial clauses and non-finite clauses. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been learning about food rationing during WW2 and in Science, they have designed burglar alarms. In French, Year 6 have continued with phonetics and in Computing, they have been recreating logos. In Art, they have been producing Remembrance inspired art work.











Next week, in Maths, the children will be solving multi-step problems and in English, they will be planning their diary entry based on Anne Frank. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children will be learning about clothing rations and making peg dolls.

Experience is good but we are willing to train!



Local News





Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.

If vehicles are in parked in contravention the registered keepers will receive a Penalty Charge Notice.

These restrictions are in place to provide a safe area outside of the school where the children will gather or cross the road therefore, we ask for your help in keeping this area free of parked vehicles.
