## Nursery and 30hrs: Percy Shaw Class



Well, what a wonderful week we have had learning about birthdays! The children were captivated by the games, the gifts and the traditions so we decided to have our very own party on Thursday with cakes, games, balloons and party clothes.

It's easy to forget that the skills needed for these events are very important. While the children are having fun, they are also learning to wait, win, lose, eat new things, try new activities and all while being excited! We also went outside, across the car park and picked apples from our tree. What a lot of things to learn from the world on our doorstep!

Next week, we are learning about how our bodies are the same, and different.


## Reception: Mary Anning Class



This week we have been learning about Birthdays; why we have birthdays, how we change as we grow, how we celebrate our birthdays and when they are. The children made fantastic birthday cake hats and pictures and wrote ' am...' and added their age. In Maths, we have been matching and sorting objects, looking for things that are the same and things that are different about them.


Next week, we will be learning about our bodies, continuing to talk about how we change as we grow and naming different body parts.


## Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class

In Maths, the children are ordering objects and ordering numbers and in English, they have been writing a letter to mummy pig from 'The 3 Little Pigs.' In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 1 have been learning about Florence Nightingale's later life and in Art, they created repeated patterns using Styrofoam. In Science, the children tested different materials for a teddy.


Next week, in Maths the children will be learning 2D and 3D shapes and in English, they will make their own story. In Clarborough Curriculum, they will be listening to a nurse talking about conditions in the hospitals.


## Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class

In Maths, Year 2 have been sorting money and learning about pounds and pence.

In English, they have been covering adjectives, proper nouns and commas and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been looking at the story of Moses and identifying the countries where Mary Seacole visited.

In Science, the children investigated different materials.



Next week, in Maths they will be counting in $2 \mathrm{~s}, 5 \mathrm{~s}, 10 \mathrm{~s}$ and 3 s and also learning to give change. In English, the children will be using question words and in Science, they will be investigating the suitability of materials.

## Year 3: Mary Jackson Class



This week, in Maths, Year 3 have been comparing objects and numbers and also counting in 50s. In English, the children have been writing the story of Perseus and Medusa. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been making Greek vases and learning about Greek goddesses and gods. In Science, the children have been using observational skills to find the odd one out and in Computing, the children have been learning about copying and pasting and changing font colour and size.



Next week, in Maths, the children will be adding and subtracting multiples of 100, 3-digit and 1-digit numbers. In English, they will be publishing their stories about Perseus and also writing sentences with adjectives. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children will be painting their Greek vases.

## Year 4: Richard Leakey Class



In Maths, the children have been telling the time converting from 12 hours to 24 hours and solving time word problems. In English, they have completed some persuasive posters based on the Firework Maker's Daughter.

In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 4 have started presentations on Gods and Kings related to the Shang Dynasty.


In Science and Art, the children have carried out further research on Andy Warhol and took part in an invertebrate hunt and classification.

Next week, in Maths the children will be doing more time word problems together with Roman Numerals and addition and subtraction word problems. In English, they will be completing non-chronological reports on Chinese dragons and learning about pronouns. In Clarborough Curriculum, they will be learning about
oracle bones and priests and in Art, they will complete a piece of work based on Andy Warhol. In Science, they will be looking at plant classification.

## Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class



In Maths this week, Year 5 have been adding and subtracting more 4 digit numbers and in English they are planning a biography on Queen Elizabeth II.

In Art, they are creating their own ideas for a sculpture and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children are creating a poster on crime and punishments based in Tudor times.


Next week, they will be continuing adding and subtracting in Maths. In English, Year 5 will be writing up their biographies. In Art, they will be making their own sculptures and in Clarborough Curriculum, they will cover illnesses and diseases in Tudor times.


## Year 6: Alan Turing Class

In Maths, Year 6 have been learning common multiples and common factors. In English, the children are learning about speech and creating dialogue. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have been learning about The Blitz and producing a double page spread and in French, they are learning sounds, vowels and letters.

In PE, the children have been enjoying passing, throwing and catching in rugby.

Next week, the children will be writing a newspaper report in English and learning prime numbers, square numbers and cubed numbers in Maths. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children will work on their propaganda posters about The Blitz.

Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.
