Dear Parents and Carers,

Please also note that Breakfast club starts from 7.45am and children will not be allowed into school before this time. Thank you.





Nursery and 30hrs: Percy Shaw Class



What a lot we have packed into a four-day week! Photos, tree hugging, an Autumn walk, dancing in the rain, painting, crafting AND learning how to share, make friends, draw, listen, chase, stop chasing when it scares our friends and so much more. The highlight was discovering a hedgehog on our field. After a long, gentle look, our planning went off at a tangent and we have been learning about these night time creatures.





Next week, we will be thinking about special days and how we celebrate them in different ways, including looking at the Hindu festival of Diwali.

Reception: Mary Anning Class



This week we have been talking about our bodies and identifying different features such as our chest, knees, elbows, chins etc. We have looked at the effects of exercise on our bodies by feeling how fast our heart beats after running and jumping, and have talked about how to keep our bodies fit and healthy. The children have been spotting their veins and bones underneath their skin and have looked at a skeleton to see how our bones fit together. We have also continued to talk about how we change as we grow.

On Thursday we found something very exciting near the shed...a hedgehog! The children were very careful, making sure that they were quiet and moving slowly so that they didn't scare it - they were so quiet that the hedgehog didn't even roll into a ball!

Next week, we will be thinking about special days and learning about the Hindu festival of Diwali.








Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class

In Year 1 Maths this week, the children have been learning the names of 2D and 3D shapes and in English, they have been planning their own stories of the Three Little Pigs ... with a twist! In Clarborough Curriculum, two nurses came in to see Year 1 to talk about hospitals today. The children were then able to compare hospitals now to the time of Florence Nightingale. The nurses also taught them how to put on a bandage. In Art the children were printing with leaves they had found outside.















Next week, Year 1 will be making patterns with 2D and 3D shapes in Maths. In English they will be writing the stories they have been planning and in Clarborough Curriculum, they are completing their 'Show me what you know' sheets about Florence Nightingale. In Computing, the children will be practising their typing skills.



Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class

In Maths, Year 2 have been counting coins as well as counting in tens on number lines. In English, they have been writing questions and finding out the features of a letter and in Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been finding out about Mary Seacole. In French, they have been learning the names of shapes – les formes!






Next week, Year 2 will be finding change with money. They will be writing a letter to the wolf from 'The 3 Little Pigs' and they will be finding out about the properties of materials in Clarborough Curriculum.

Year 3: Mary Jackson Class



In Maths, the children have been working with multiples of 2, 3, 5 and 50 together with completing adding and subtracting problems. In English, they have been writing their stories about Perseus and Medusa – using expanded noun phrases! In Clarborough Curriculum they have painted the first coat of their Greek-inspired vases and they have also been finding out about the

origins of the Olympic Games.








The children also completed some Compliment cards for each other and it was so lovely to read so many thoughtful compliments from the children!

Next week, the children will be adding and subtracting with 1- and 2-digit numbers. They will be using adjectives to describe sounds and understanding a preposition as a single work that describes time (yesterday, later). They will also be adding detail to their vases before they go home for display. They will also be finding out how the Ancient Greeks influenced the modern world. They will be finding out about places special to Christians and finally, they will be learning how fossils are formed.

Year 4: Richard Leakey Class



In Maths this week, the children have been solving problems involving rounding numbers accurately. In English, they have been focusing on Rainbow Grammar, looking at determiners, prepositional phrases using adverbs of duration (e.g. later that day). In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 4 have been creating presentations on the Shang Dynasty and they have been creating pop art in the style of Andy Warhol. They have also been finding out about the Hajj – Muslim pilgrimages.










Next week, Year 4 will be completing one-step worded problems in Maths and writing an information report on the Shang Dynasty. In Science, Year 4 will be looking at local habitats and in Clarborough Curriculum, they will be looking at dragon bones (not literally!) and Chinese writing.

Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class



This week, the children have been using the inverse operations for addition and subtraction and in English, they have published their biographies on Queen Elizabeth II. Year 5 have been finding out about illnesses and diseases during the Tudor times as part of Clarborough Curriculum. The children have also begun to make clay sculptures in the style of Antony Gormley in their Art lessons. In Computing, they have been text-based programming.










Next week, the children staying in school will be taking part in a surprise project while the others are on the residential in Hathersage.




Year 6: Alan Turing Class

This week, the Year 6 pupils have been using square and cubed numbers. They have also been learning more about prime numbers and BODMAS. In English, they have been drafting their newspaper articles and finding out about the aircraft used during The Blitz. They have also been practising phonetics, the alphabet and vowels in French! (Ooh! La, La!). Their Art work has involved

sketching planes and creating propaganda posters and in Computing, they have finished their unit on e-Safety.

Local News

Nottinghamshire County Council use CCTV cars to enforce parking outside of schools. They visit schools in Nottinghamshire and will record whilst passing, the details of any cars parked illegally.
