Please note that fidget toys or any other sort of toy <u>should not</u> be brought into school unless you have spoken with your teacher and they have permitted your child to bring it in.


## Nursery and 30hrs (Frida Kahlo)

This week, the children have been counting to 50 and finding missing numbers on a number line. They have also been counting backwards and forwards from 50.



The children in Year 1 have listened to the story of Eva Hart, a survivor from the Titanic.

They wrote stories about what happened at the beginning, middle and end of the journey.





In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been so excited to learn about the Titanic and how the ship sank.

Next week in Maths, the children will be partitioning numbers into tens and ones and in English, they will be planning a diary entry using adjectives to describe how a passenger might have felt.

# Year 2 (L.S. Lowry)

In Year 2 this week, they have been focusing on the 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. They have written their own descriptions about where the lighthouse keeper lived and worked. They have also made predictions about how the story will end.

The children have also been practising their addition and subtraction skills in Maths. They have been finding out about Jesus and the Easter story in RE.

Next week, Year 2 will be multiplying and dividing in Maths. They will be writing character descriptions based on 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' and retelling the story. They will also be beginning their new focus on the seaside.

## Year 3 (William Morris)

This week, the children have been reading 'Street Child'. This links to their new focus in Clarborough Curriculum on the Victorians.

In English, the children have had a grammatical focus on apostrophes. Their focus in Maths this week has been on seconds and minutes. In PE, the children have started to learn about cricket and they have also been learning about light in Science.

Next week, on Tuesday, the children are having a special Victorian Day where they will be dressing up and enjoy being a Victorian child in school.

### Year 4 (Salvador Dali)

This week the children have been starting their new focus on the Mayflower (the ship that the Pilgrim Fathers sailed to America on). Year 4 have been playing games like those the travellers played on deck



(Noughts and Crosses, Catch the Cup and Skittles).

In RE they have created role plays to reenact the journey Jesus took to be crucified on the cross – photos are on Seesaw.

Next week, the children will learn more about the Mayflower and they will be working on decimals in Maths

## Year 5 (Banksy)

This week the children have been ordering and comparing decimals to three places. They have also been finding the perimeter of 2D shapes, including rectangles. The children have started to learn about rivers – they have found some of the key rivers in the UK and noted the main towns nearby using maps. They have also learnt that a river starts at the source and flows into the sea via the mouth.

In Computing, the children have been making mazes using Scratch and programming it to collect coins and find an exit.

# Year 6 (Lucian Freud)

In Maths the Year 6 children have been doing quad Maths and algebra. They have been solving equations too. In English, the focus has been grammar, looking particularly at hyphens and semi-colons. They have also been finding out the difference between passive and active voice.

In RE, they have been combining art and making collages of the Easter story. Their Clarborough Curriculum focus is Vikings for this term and in PSHE they will be looking at financial rewards and money matters.

Next week, the children will be writing instructions in English, calculating percentages in Maths and looking at Viking gods.
