During the next two weeks we will be turning our attention to London vehicles as we prepare for the Queen's Jubilee.






Reception (Georgia O'Keeffe)

This week we have been finding out about emergency vehicles that help us when we are hurt or ill, such as ambulances, air ambulances and paramedic cars. We have also been counting to 100, counting in 10s and looking at the numbers in a 100 square to see if we can spot any numerical patterns.

We have been practising writing tricky words from memory and have been using capital letters at the beginning of a sentence and full-stops at the end.

Year 1 (Joan Miro)



they will be counting in fives and tens.













Star of the week: Tobias for planning a fantastic fact file about the Titanic. You included so much information and we are so proud of you!

This week, the children have been writing a recount of their trip to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park. In Maths, they have been working on fractions in preparation for their assessments next week. The Year 2 children have also been helping Year 1 children with their models of the Titanic and they have been looking at seasides from past to present in their Clarborough Curriculum.

Star of the week: Isabella for always putting 100% into everything and for always being so polite to others in class!


Year 3 (William Morris)



This week, the children have been focusing on their setting descriptions, using personification. They have been creating cartoon strips to retell chapter Six, 'Tip.' The children have been finding and recognising quarters and thirds in Maths and their Science work has been focusing on reflection. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 have found out about jobs for Victorian children.

Next week, the children will be creating tension by using connectives in English. In Maths, they will be understanding the difference between unit and non-unit fractions and as part of their Clarborough Curriculum, they will be going on a trip to the Bassetlaw Museum.

Year 4 (Salvador Dali)


Star of the week: Heidi F for showing a hardworking determined attitude to succeed all week. Your writing is incredible!

In Maths this week, the children have been comparing and using fractions, percentages and decimals. In English, the children have been busy using a story map to produce their own river stories. They have created 'rivers of the world' posters in Clarborough Curriculum and interviewing people about their posters.

Next week, Year 5 will focus on the features of a river in Clarborough Curriculum. They will add to their creative story writing plans using their senses to help their description.


