



















Nursery and 30hrs: Percy Shaw Class

We hope that they may get a chance to see some of the ceremony on the television, as they are good at naming King Charles, Queen Camilla, the soldiers, crown, sceptre, orb, bunting, and parade as well as many other words and concepts associated with the event. Reception: Mary Anning Class




This week, we have been learning about London and the Coronation of King Charles III. We have learnt the names of the River Thames and famous landmarks such as Tower Bridge, Buckingham Palace, the London Eye and Big Ben. The children have made flags and crowns for the celebration and have drawn pictures and maps of London.

As part of getting ready for their move into Year 1, the children have begun

to learn about writing sentences using Rainbow Grammar - this week they have been identifying nouns.

Next week, we will continue to learn about our emotions, focusing on anger; what makes us angry and how we can help ourselves to calm down. We will also be learning about verbs.







Year 1: Garrett Morgan Class



This week in Maths, Year 1 have been representing numbers to 50 and looking at one more and one less (within 50). In English, the children have been focusing on the text 'The Queen's Lift-Off' and then designing and labelling their own rockets. In Clarborough Curriculum, they have been naming, locating and identifying characteristics of four countries and capital cities and in Computing, they have been changing characters and individual pixels. In Art, Year 1 have been looking at the work of Van Gogh

and also a portrait of King Charles III.

Next week, Year 1 will be comparing objects within 50 and designing a new planet!






Year 2: Professor Brian Cox Class




This week, Year 2 have been completing SATs revision. In Maths, the children have been looking at fractions, arrays and money. In English, they have been innovating 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch'. The children have been writing independently using contractions with apostrophes, connectives and adjectives. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 2 have been looking at natural and man-made objects at the seaside and in French, they have been learning how to say the names of vegetables and how to ask for a kilo of vegetables. In Science, the children took part in a plant experiment looking at which plant will grow faster using variables such as sunlight and water. The children learnt what plants require to grow and stay healthy. In Computing, the children had their second animation lesson, learning how to flip an object.

Next week, Year 2 will be completing more SATs revision. Papers and resources have been put on Seesaw to help you with this.







Year 3: Mary Jackson Class




This week in Maths, Year 3 have been comparing volume in ml and litres, and looking at temperature (Celsius). In English, the children have been writing a description of what it would be like to live and work in a Workhouse based around their class text 'Street Child.' In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 looked at the jobs children had in Victorian times and made some royal crowns in celebration of the Coronation this weekend. In Art, the children continued with their portraits of King Charles III and in French, they have been discussing which fruits they like or dislike.

Next week, Year 3 will be completing fraction work and looking at making a whole and counting in tenths. In English, they will be designing a cartoon strip based on the character 'Tip' and in Science, they will be looking at sun safety. In Clarborough Curriculum, Year 3 will be understanding the Industrial Revolution and looking at the impact this had on history.














Year 4: Richard Leakey Class




This week in Maths, Year 4 have continued to look at decimals, and multiplying and dividing by 100 to convert decimals into percentages and back again. In English, they have looked at using non-finite clauses to add detail to their sentences and using adverbial clauses to begin their sentences. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children took an in depth look at the journey the pilgrims made across the ocean on the Mayflower. They also looked at the Americas including the countries and capitals in both North and South America. In Art, Year 4 created some Coronation celebratory art, in Computing they created animated

movement paths to show directions on a map and in Science, they investigated heating and melting.

Next week, Year 4 will be writing their opening and ending of their stories. In Maths, they will be looking at problems involving money and in Science, they will be learning about The Water Cycle.






Year 5: Hedy Lamarr Class




This week in Maths, Year 5 have been adding and subtracting decimals with a different number of decimal places. In English, they have been completing their opening of the story 'The Egyptian Cinderella' and in History, the children have been understanding and explaining the ancient Egyptian ritual of mummification. They have really enjoyed mummifying tomatoes as part of their Science lesson! In Computing, the children have been programming distance sensing and movement

using a virtual robot and in Art, they have been using charcoal to create self-portraits.

Next week, Year 5 will be looking at decimal sequences in Maths and writing the middle part of their story in English. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children will be looking at evidence which provides us different answers about the past and in Science, they will explore the effects of water resistance. In Art, Year 5 will be using photography and other media to create mixed media self-portraits.





Year 6: Alan Turing Class



This week in Maths, Year 6 have been looking at position and direction, shapes and protractors. In English, they have been revisiting standard English including subjective form (were, be and if) and, synonyms and antonyms. In Clarborough Curriculum, the children have been learning about Danegeld and looking at poetry and in Science, they have been discussing positive and healthy relationships.

Next week is SATs week for Year 6. Please don't forget that Year 6 children are welcome to come for a 'SATs breakfast', Tuesday to Friday

at 8.30am. It is a great way for the children to relax and spend time with their friends before the papers.
