Next week, we will be learning about the Queen's Platinum Jubilee.



The children have also been looking at natural objects found at the seaside.


Next week, they will be completing their stories and learning about the Queen's Jubilee.

Next week, the class will be focusing their learning on the Queen's Jubilee. They will be creating portraits of the Queen and also be working on decimals and percentages in Maths.


